

Ship Com^d Morris of New BedfordMonday Aug. 15th

Comes in with moderate breeze from the S.W. and fine pleasant weather - Ship by the wind to the N.W. with all sail set. - Saw a steamer and one sailing vessel bound E. - saw porpoises by Grampuses - in the A.M. water little dark - in the P.M. Blue. at 6 squally with rain - shortened sail - saw several schools of Grampuses and some kind of a whale to windward breaking at sunset, wore ship heading to the S.S.W. Lat 42.25 Long 47.28

Tuesday Aug. 16th

All these 24 hours light baffling winds from the N.W. and cloudy weather and some rain nothing in sight all day but two sail and one or two schools of Grampuses and porpoises at night wind from the W. and hauled to the N.E. all night steering S.S.E. with light air Lat 42.14 N Long 48.38 W

Wednesday Aug. 17th

Comes in with cloudy weather and winds from E.S.E. looking stormy - Ship steering N.W. under easy sail - one sail in sight bound to the E. - all the P.M. rainy weather winds very baffling - from S. to N.W. - some heavy rain Lat 40.03

Thursday Aug. 18th

Comes in with a gale from the N.S.W. and cloudy weather Ship by the wind to the N.W. - nothing in sight all day in the P.M. clear weather

Friday Aug. 19th

Comes in with light air from N.E. and fine pleasant weather. Ship steering by the wind all day on various tacks cruising - Saw two or three sail working to the E. saw several Dolphins Albatross and Shearwater. but no signs of Sperm Whales

Saturday Aug. 20th

Comes in with light winds from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather - Ship steering N.W. with all sail and one sail, in the A.M. steering to the W. - saw Grampuses in the P.M. saw two sail - Ship steering N.W. per compass - in the P.M. some rain and strong breeze Lat 41.00 N Temp of W. 77 Long 48.06 W

Sunday Aug. 21th

Comes in with a gale of wind from the land cloudy weather - Ship steering N.W. with all prudent sail set. saw two sail one steering to the W. one to the E. spoke the one bound E. was 14 days from New Orleans with cotton for London - by her we first heard of the war in Europe between France and Prussia - at night blowing a gale - ship under close reefed maintopsail and storm sails heading S.S.W. water rather changeable Green and blue
