Saturday Nov. 12th

Came in with a gale from the S. and an ugly sea running from all directions. Ship steering S. E. with all prudent sail out. Weather thick and hazy. At 10 a.m. raised sperm whales going quite quick N.W. - lowered all four boats and chased. Got two one to Starb. and one to W. Boat. Starb. Boat got badly stove, and did not get his whale alongside until 11 P.M. Whales about 40 each. - saw only eight or ten

Sunday Nov. 13th

Came in with moderate weather but a very heavy sea on running from all directions. At daylight hooked on to the whales and cut them both in by 5 P.M. - started the work

Came in with moderate breezes from the S. E. and fine weather. Ship by the wind to the S. E. under easy sail. At 7 a.m. raised a school of sperm whales large school and very still lowered three boats and took one to each boat. Mate taking Starb. Boat. Got them all to the ship by 2 P.M. and at 4 commenced cutting. By 9 got them all in - whale about 15 blbs each.
