

Ship Com. Morris of New Bedford

Saturday Dec. 24th

Comes in with strong gales from N.W. and thick foggy rainy weather. Ship by the wind - different parts cruising with all prudent sail out - nothing in sight all day but birds and schools of small fish.

Sunday Dec. 25th

Comes in with strong N.W. gales and overcast - ship by the wind - cruising with all prudent sail out. Nothing in sight all day - at night quite moderate weather. Lat at merid. 38.25

Monday Dec. 26th

Comes in with fresh breezes from the N.W. and thick foggy weather. Ship cruising by the wind with all prudent sail out. Nothing in sight all day but birds and porpoises.

Tuesday Dec. 27th

Comes in with fresh breezes from the N. and squally weather. Ship cruising by the wind to the W. with all prudent sail out until 9 a.m. then kept off for Senegambia - weather squally with rain. Taped St. Michaels about 12 M. and at sunset saw the island of St. Mary. - passed it and kept ship S.E. by compass.

Wednesday Dec. 28th

Comes in with moderate breezes from the N. and quite fine weather. Ship steering S.E. with all sail out for Senegambia. Nothing in sight all day but one sail steering to the W. Calm nearly all night.

In The North Atlantic Ocean

Thursday Dec. 29th

Comes in with light baffling air from the W. and N.W. and from that to S.E. W. and some squalls of rain. Ship steering S.E. with all sail out. Nothing in sight but one sail steering to the S.W.

Friday Dec. 30th

Comes in with strong gales from the N.W. and N. with some squalls of rain - ship steering S.E. with all sail out for Senegambia. Nothing in sight all day. Lat at merid 32.25

Long by Chron 20.10

Saturday Dec. 31st

Comes in with strong gales from the N.E. and squally weather. Ship by the wind to the S.E. for the island of Senegambia - nothing in sight all day. Lat. 30.04

Long 18.40

Sunday Jan. 1st 1841

Comes in with strong gales from the E. and squally weather. Ship by the wind under whole topsails. at sunrise saw the island of Senegambia bearing - North point - S.E. per compass. Lat at merid 28.33

Long by Chron 16.46

Monday Jan. 2nd

Comes in with strong breezes from the N.E. ship standing in for the anchorage at St. Mary. - at 10 went on shore but could not land. The health officer had visited the ship. Found her the Bk. W. Henry. Green 330 spms. obtained letters and a few articles of recruits and took two men Portuguese from the shore and landed two that stowed away on board at St. Michaels, and left at 7 P.M.
