

Ship Com. Morris of New Bedford

Friday July 14th

All day light breeze from S.W. and somewhat hazy weather Ship standing to the S with all sail out. St. Michaels and a schooner in sight to the leeward - ship standing to the S in order to get around the W end of St. Michaels and go into St. M. Bay on the north side of the island - at 2 P.M. put the mate Mr. Winslow off duty for general incompetence and a neglect of duty. Found today six stow-aways on board - all night ship lying aback.

Saturday July 15th

Comes in with breezes from the S.W. and stormy weather and heavy squalls of rain - ship standing in for St. Michaels bay - at 9 A.M. entered the Bay - sent the 4th mate with three of the crew on shore, returning with the other three on board - all the P.M. cruised in the bay and at 12 M. made sail for Terceira - saw one brig sheering to E.

Sunday July 16th

Comes in with strong breezes from the S.W. and fine pleasant weather - Ship between the islands of St. Michaels and Terceira steering over for the last named island with all sail out - Nothing in sight but one schooner steering to the S.W. from under Terceira at sundown two sail in sight 2 of them we call whalers.

Monday July 17th

Comes in with fresh breezes from the S.W. and fine weather Ship by the wind working up between the islands of St. George and Terceira, Bk. Wm. Henry and Ocean steered in sight cruising - at 6 spoke Bk O.C. with 40 Bk since East saw her, also spoke at same time Bk President Seabury A.W. 27 m. out with 40 Bk all told - The several islands in sight restored Mr. Winslow to duty.

Cruising In The North Atlantic Ocean

Tuesday July 18th

Comes in with fresh breezes from the S.W. and quite clear weather Ship cruising by the wind on the north side of Terceira - One sail the Wm. Henry in sight to the E. In the P.M. working to the W.

Wednesday July 19th

All day light breezes from the N.E. and fine clear weather Ship cruising to the N and W of the island of Terceira in co with Bk Wm. Henry - In the P.M. Bk Ocean steered in sight all standing in toward St. George.

Thursday July 20th

All day light winds and pleasant weather - ship off and on at St. George - left on shore obtaining recruits - obtained about a doz fowls - 10 Bu. of P. potatoes 10 doz eggs and about 300⁰⁰ cheese Bk. O.C. and Wm. Henry also obtaining recruits at St. George - Nothing happening worthy of note - five men stowed away on board at this place four of them good looking and stout fellows the other a mere boy.

Friday July 21st

All day sharp calm Ship working to the S.W. the Wm. Henry steering the same the O.C. off and on at Graciosa - The several Islands of the group in sight - saw plenty of porpoises and grampuses - several schools of small fish and other indications of sperm whales.

Saturday July 22nd

All day light buffing winds from the N.W. and calm Ship steering S.W. with all sail out - The various islands and three sail in sight, the Wm. Henry steering N.E. also.
