

Ship Com^d Morris of New BedfordThursday Oct. 19th 1871

Comes in with moderate breezes from the S.W. and fine pleasant weather. Ship cruising to the N.E. with all sail set. Nothing in sight all day - water blue and clear - No signs of Whales

Friday Oct. 20th

Comes in with strong gales from the S.W. and hazy weather. Ship cruising to the N.E. with all prudent sail set. Nothing in sight all day. - Wind and sea, part wind and weather the same

Lat 38.56
Long 41.56

Saturday Oct. 21st

All these 24 hours a gale of wind from the S.W. and rainy weather with very poor seeing. Ship steering to per compass with all prudent sail set. Nothing in sight all day.

Lat. 39.10
Long 40.00

Sunday Oct. 22nd

All this day strong gales from the NW and cloudy weather. Ship steering to by S per compass with all prudent sail set. Saw one sail steering to the E. - Saw also one school of Blackfish - being rough weather did not lower for them.

Monday Oct. 23rd

All day light air and calm, winds from N.E. and E. Ship by the wind all day to the S.E. and S. - One sail in sight steering to the E. - Saw one long tailed bird nothing else all day - water blue and clear with patches of Gulf weeds.

Saw birds and other indications of whales

Cruising In The North Atlantic

Tuesday Oct. 24th 1871

All day moderate breezes from the S.W. ship steering to S.E. for the Island of Flores - Nothing in sight all day - no indications of whales or anything else.

Wednesday Oct. 25th

All day light baffling winds from the S.W. and cloudy weather. Ship steering for the Isle of Flores - saw several sail straight the day all steering to the E. and S.E. - no signs of Whales

Thursday Oct. 26th

Comes in with light baffling air from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather. Ship going off and on at Leorro - left on shore trading - obtained here one bullock a lot of fowls 10 bu of Shred Potatoes and a lot of eggs. - at 2 P.M. left ship off for Nagal with the view of cruising. One sail we called the Alaska here in sight of just as we was leaving Leorro

Friday Oct. 27th

All day light winds from the N.W. and hazy weather. Ship steering S.E. for Nagal. At 4 P.M. spoke the American Brig Morning Star 36 days from the Clyde with crew for New York - was leaking bad and steering for Nagal for repairs. At 4 P.M. lowered all four boats for Blackfish without success - Nagal in sight - wind changed suddenly to the N.E.

Saturday Oct. 28th

All day strong breezes from the N.W. and cloudy weather. Ship cruising off to the North of Nagal - saw nothing - ran through the passage and spoke the ship Young Phoenix of N.Y. 24 days out clean
