

4 Ship Commodore Morris of New Bedford

Sunday May 19th 1892
All day Breeze. Pleasant weather - Ship at
anchored in Prince Rupert Bay - a part of
the crew on shore on liberty - have bottled
out the Kumpack making about 20 Bbls.

Monday May 20th 1892
All day strong W & Trades and somewhat
squally weather - all hands employed in trill-
ing for recruits getting off water and doing other
boat duty - at 1 P.M. Bk. Wark towed
her anchor and stood out to sea - Got off
2 raft 180 Bbls of water and stowed it

Tuesday May 21st 1841
4th day all hands employed in getting off water
obtaining fruit & vegetables &c. fine calm weather
B. & W. went out last night or yesterday
afternoon. Nothing new worthy of note. Fine
excellent water and easy getting it at Picards
Estate on the South side of the Bay. Not
being acquainted we anchored farther from the
river than was necessary or convenient.

Wednesday May 22nd 1872
All day fine pleasant weather excepting a few
light rain showers in the a.m. all hands
getting off and stowing wood and water, and
making preparations for getting under weigh - have
taken on Board at this place about 450 Bbls of wood
4 cords of wood a lot of Bananas Broom stuff
gams, Sweet Potatoes, Pine Apples and other
small stuff too numerous to mention - at 6
P.m. took our anchor and stood out of the
Bay for Cautations with moderate breezes
from S.W. and fine weather
