

Saturday June 8th 1872

All day fresh breezes from the S.W. and quite good weather. Ship off and on off the south side of Bermuda. Capt. & family on shore. At dusk Capt. & family all on Board having obtained Onions, Potatoes & Tomatoes. At night standing off shore in Co. with Bk Wave Capt. Briggs.

Sunday June 9th 1872

All day fresh breezes from the S.W. and fine weather. Ship off and on at Bermuda. all hands on board. At 10 A.M. spoke Bk Wave. Capt. Briggs came on board and remained until 2 P.M. both vessels off and on nothing more in sight all day.

Monday June 10th 1872

All day strong breezes from the S.W. and hazy weather. Ship off south side of Bermuda. At 8 A.M. Capt. went on shore for letters and at 1 P.M. returned having obtained but a few. In the P.M. standing out to the south with all prudent sail on. Nothing in sight.

Tuesday June 11th 1872

All day moderate breezes from the S.W. and quite clear weather. Ship by the wind to the S.E. with all prudent sail out. At 12 M. saw a carcass about a week old. Nothing more in sight all day. Ship cruising to the S and W.

Wednesday June 12th 1872

All day light breezes from the S.W. and fine pleasant weather. Ship cruising on different tacks with all prudent sail out. Nothing in sight but one sail steering to the N.E. No signs of whales here no birds or fish. At 7 P.M. tacked ship standing to the S.

Thursday June 13th 1872

Came in with light baffling winds from the W & N.W. and fine pleasant weather. Ship in the morn by the wind to the S. at 6 kept her off to the E and put on all sail winds light. No indications of whales at 12 M. calm. At 2 P.M. light breezes from S.W. Nothing in sight.

Friday June 14th 1872

All day light baffling air from all quarters & calm. Nothing in sight all day. No Obs.

Saturday June 15th 1872

Came in with light breezes from S.E. W. and fine weather. Ship steering E by S with all sail out for the Western Ground. Nothing in sight all day.

Sunday June 16th 1872

All day moderate breezes from the S.W. and fine weather. Ship steering E per compass with all sail out. Nothing in sight but two or three sail steering to the S.E. Saw a few birds and some jellies & Gallen Drops in the water and plenty of Gulf Weed.
