

Monday July 15th 1872

All day light baffling winds from the N. & S.W. and squally weather with some heavy rain. Ship working to the W with all prudent sail out. In the morn. Fogal in sight bearing E.S.E. Dist 30. m. watch all day employed in different jobs about the ship. Nothing more in sight.

Tuesday July 16th 1872

First part light baffling winds from the S.W. and thick hazy weather. Ship working to the W. with all sail out. Stores & Leavo both in sight. Ship working up between them. Wind hauling to the N.W. In the P.M. quite clear weather saw two sail standing to the N.E.

Wednesday July 17th 1872

All day light baffling winds from the W and N.W. Ship by the wind on different tacks cruising with all prudent sail out. Nothing in sight but birds jellies Vallow Drops &c and one or two sail.

Thursday July 18th 1872

All day strong gales of wind and squalls of rain from the W and N.W. Ship by the wind on different tacks, working to the W. under double reefed topsails. at 12 heavy weather took in fore & main topsails & foresail. saw one sail. nothing more in sight all day. No Obs.

Friday July 19th 1872

First part strong gales from the N.W. and cloudy weather. Ship by the wind to the N.E. under double reefed topsails and courses. at 12 clear weather. Nothing in sight but two or three drift logs strong breezes took in main sail and spanker.

Saturday July 20th 1872

All day light baffling winds from the N.E. & E. and fine weather but a heavy swell from the N.W. Ship by the wind to the W.N.W. with all sail except maintopsail (that being on deck undergoing repairs) until 12 M. then wore ship heading E.S.E. all the P.M. nothing in sight but one sail (steering to the E.) and three schools of porpoises. Some jellies and many Vallow Drops in the water also. at 4 P.M. sent up maintopsail and set it. Ship working to the E.

Sunday July 21st 1872

All day light baffling winds from the S.W. and cloudy weather. Ship steering N.E. with all sail out. Nothing in sight all day but a few Vallow Drops and Pungulls Voadstoos &c at night shortened sail.

Monday July 22^d 1872

All day light baffling winds from the E. and cloudy weather. Ship steering N.E. with all sail out. Nothing in sight all day but one or two schools of porpoises Vallow Drops Voadstoos &c.

Tuesday July 23rd 1872

All day light baffling winds from the S and E. and fine clear weather. Ship steering N.E. with all sail out. Nothing in sight but one sail and several schools of porpoises plenty of Vallow Drops but no other indications of whales. Ship working for the 43/33 Grand Lat 40.27 Long 34.69
