

Wednesday July 24th 1872
 All day light baffling winds from the S.W. and clear warm weather. Ship steering N.E. by E. with all sail out cruising. Nothing in sight all day but one finback and two schools of porpoises. Water blue and clear with some Pallow Drops and a few Dead stools & ribbons but poor indications for whales.
 Lat. at merid. 41.17
 Long. by Chron. 33.04

Thursday July 25th 1872
 Comes in with light baffling winds from the west and overcast. Ship steering N.E. by E. with all sail out cruising. Saw one finback breaching. A sail in sight all steering to the E. S. E. - Not a bird seen for two days.
 Lat. 42.27
 Long. 33.09

Friday July 26th 1872
 All first part of the 24 hours thick fog and light breezes from the S.W. Ship steering N.E. by E. with all sail out. at 7 A.M. luffed to the wind N.W. In the P.M. clouds more broken and the fog more in veins. Saw one sail steering to the N.E. with all sail out. Saw at night a few long tailed birds and a few Dead stools in the water.

Saturday July 27th 1872
 First part strong gales from S.W. with overcast weather and showers of rain. Poor seeing two sail in sight steering to the N.E. with all sail out. Nothing indicating whales except a few Dead stools. At sundown saw white water several times but could not make it out. In the P.M. weather changeable.
 Lat 43.48
 Long 33.30

Sunday July 28th 1872
 All day strong breezes from the S.W. and overcast with fog and rain. Ship by the wind to the N.W. with all sail out. cruising to the N.W. - Nothing in sight all day but one school of porpoises and a few Mungalls and two pieces of squid.
 Lat. at merid. 44.10
 No Obs. for Long.

Monday July 29th 1872
 Comes in with moderate breezes from the S.W. and foggy weather. Ship by the wind to the N.W. but at 6 A.M. were ship heading S. with all sail out. Nothing in sight but one school of porpoises and a few pieces of drift stuff.
 Lat. 44.22

Tuesday July 30th 1872
 All day fresh breezes from the S.W. and misty weather and fog. Ship by the wind to the S and S.W. with all sail out. Nothing in sight all day.
 Lat. at merid. 42.56
 Long. by Chron. 36.04

Wednesday July 31st 1872
 All day moderate breezes from S.W. in the A.M. misty weather in the P.M. clear. Ship by the wind to the S with all sail out. Nothing in sight all day. In the P.M. picked up a spar 52 feet long 15 in. square. hard pine. Saw Pallow Drops and Dead stools quite plenty and some tide ribs.
 Lat. at merid. 41.23
