

Tuesday Oct. 8th 1872

All day fresh breezes and squally weather from the N.W. Ship steering E.S.E. for Poyai with all sail out. - saw one sail steering E.S.E. No Obs.

Wednesday Oct. 9th 1872

All day fresh breezes from the N.W. and squally weather. Ship steering E.S.E. for Poyai with all prudent sail out. - nothing in sight all day. - The Whale having turned up on deck 75 Bbls

Thursday Oct. 10th 1872

Came in with a gale of wind and rain from N.E. and very bad weather. Ship steering E.S.E. with all prudent sail out. for Poyai at 8 hove ship to by the wind heading E under close reefed maintop sail - the weather being very bad - soon after luffing the ship to the wind discovered that the shaft to the Old of the wheel had given out - lashed the latter and put in a new shaft - the weather being thick all day lying by and on different tacks - at night little more moderate made some sail. Lat 38.42

Friday Oct. 11th 1872

Came in with strong gales from the E and squally weather. Ship by the wind to the S. under double reefed topsails - saw through the day one sulphur bottom, plenty of Dolphin and several schools of small fish - coopered the oil to reach for landing - at 4 P.M. wore ship heading N.E.

Saturday Oct. 12th 1872

All day light baffling winds from the N.E. and E.S.E. with fine pleasant weather Ship working to the N.E. for the S. side of Pico - Pico & Poyai in sight

Sunday Oct. 13th 1872

All day, slight baffling air from all quarters. Ship lying in the doldrums on the S. side of Pico some six or seven miles from land. Nothing in sight all day but one Barkentine bound E. - at 8 P.M. a boat from the shore came alongside for Tobacco - accommodated them with about 600 lbs. - then steered off for Poyai

Monday Oct. 14th 1872

All day fresh breezes from the N.E. and thick cloudy weather. Ship off and on at Poyai - Landed for shipment home thirteen casks containing 2386 Gallons of Sperm Oil - consigned to Cha. W. Labney & Sons - received from them a receipt for the same. - Settled up all my bills and after obtaining 5 Bar corn 24 do Beans, 50 Lumpkins 18 Fowls & several Baskets of Fruit. Kept ship off at dusk for the Cape de Verde.

Tuesday Oct. 15th 1872

All day fresh breezes from the N.E. and cloudy weather. Ship steering S.S.W. with all sail for Cape de Verde - sent up fore royal and fore topmast reduced studdensail
