

Thursday Oct. 31st 1872

Come in with moderate S.E. trades and fine weather. Ship on different tacks cruising with all sail out. Sail we call the Bk Janus in sight cutting - at 1 P.M. spoke her had got 5 whales 150 Bbls. yesterday. - Saw in the P.M. a sail steering to the N. with all sail out. Heard some but little indications of whales - but a few Blackfish or small fish.

Leat at merid 7.39

Long by local 22.20

Friday Nov. 1st 1872

All day light airs and calms. Nothing in sight but Blackfish and porpoises. Some light showers in the P.M. Ship cruising on different tacks with all sail out.

Leat at merid 7.24

Long by chron. 22.39

Saturday Nov. 2^d 1872

All day light airs from the E. & S.E. & calms. Ship cruising to the S.W. with all sail out. Nothing in sight but Blackfish & Porpoises. Weather rather squally.

Leat at merid 7.15

Sunday Nov. 3^d 1872

All day light baffling winds from the E. and S.E. threatening rain. Ship cruising on different tacks. Nothing in sight all day.

Monday Nov. 4th 1872

All day light baffling winds from the E. & S.E. and cloudy weather with thunder lightning & rain. Ship working to the S.W. with all sail out. Nothing in sight all day.

Tuesday Nov. 5th 1872

All day light baffling winds & calms with rain & lightning. Ship steering to the S.W. with all sail out for Pernambuco. Nothing in sight all day.

Wednesday Nov. 6th 1872

All day light baffling winds from S. & S.W. and cloudy weather. Ship steering by the wind on the western tack with all sail out working to the S.

Thursday Nov. 7th 1872

All day light baffling airs from the S. & S.W. and cloudy weather. Ship by the wind to the S.W. with all sail out. Nothing in sight all day.

Friday Nov. 8th 1872

All day light airs from the S. and quite good weather. Ship by the wind to the S.W. with all sail out. Nothing in sight all day. - crossed the Line in Long 26.40 W.

Saturday Nov. 9th 1872

All day moderate S.E. trades and fine weather. Ship steering by the wind S.W. with all sail out. Nothing in sight but one sail steering to the N.W.

Saturday Nov. 10th 1872

All day light baffling winds from the S.E. and fine weather. Ship by the wind heading S.W. with all sail out. One sail a schooner in sight steering to the N.W.
