All day strong breezes from N.W. and fine weather excepting a little overcast in the A.M. at 4 A.M. hooked on to the whale and cut him in by 3 P.M. and started the works.

Friday Jan, 10th 1873

All day fine pleasant weather with moderate breezes from the N. Ship working to the N with all prudent sail out.

Nothing but bottle nosed Grampuses in sight all day.

Saturday Jan, 11th 1873

All day light baffling winds from the N.E. & E. Ship by the board on different tacks working to the N. Watch employed in boiling and doing other necessary work about decks.

Nothing in sight but a few birds. - Water blue and clear all day. - The whale turning up on deck 135 Bbls.

Sunday Jan, 12th 1873

All day moderate breezes from the N.E. and quite clear weather Ship working to the N.E. on different tacks with all prudent sail out cruising.

Experienced for the last four days a set of about 20 miles per day to the S. - Nothing in sight all day but a few birds - Water blue & clear

Monday Jan, 13th 1873

All day moderate breezes from N.E. and overcast. Ship on different tacks working to windward with all prudent sail out all hands employed in stowing oil in the after hold, stowed 123 Bbls from the last whale saw three or four sail through the day steering to the S.W. - In the P.M. Ship steering to the E by the wind

Tuesday Jan, 14th 1873

All day moderate breezes from the N. and clear overhead but somewhat smoky horizon Ship by the wind to the E.N.E. with all prudent sail out cruising. - Water blue and clear all day with but a few birds and a few spots of Bird - One sail in sight by the wind to the E. at 7 1/2 P.M. spoke her by mate going on Board - was the Br. Brig W. H. Clements of St Johns. N. B. - 3 days from the River with Wood for Antwerp. By her we get the information that U.S. Grant had been selected for President by a large majority - and also of the death of the opposing Candidate - Mr. Horace Greeley. also learn of the great fire in Boston on the 13th of Nov. 1872
