

Monday March 24th 1873
All day strong gales from the south and
squally weather with rain - ship steering
N.E. with all sail out - sent up
main royal yard & sail - water blue
all day with quite a number of birds around
and other indications of whales - saw one
school of Bot. nosed Grampuses - poor
seeing all day
Lat 37.15
Long 50.14

Tuesday March 25th 1873
All day fresh baffling breezes from S.E.
with thick weather & rain squalls - ship steer-
ing N.E. by N. & N.E. by E with all sail
out - In the P.M. set fore topmast
& lower studding sail & fore & main royal
poor seeing all day - nothing indicating whales
but birds - In the P.M. saw one
sail steering to the S.W.

Wednesday March 26th 1873
All day strong gales from the S & S.W. and
cloudy weather - ship steering N.E. by N.
with all sail out - nothing in sight all
day - nothing indicating whales - only a few
birds
Lat 33.20
Long 46.18

Thursday March 27th 1873
All day fresh breezes from the S & S.W. and
mostly clear weather - ship steering N.E. by E
with all prudent sail out - saw three
sail working to the S.W. - nothing indicat-
ing whales - water blue & clear
Lat 31.01 Long 45.00

Friday March 28th 1873
First part light baffling winds from the E & S.E.
and cloudy weather - ship steering N.E. per com-
pass with all sail out - water blue & clear
with only a very few birds - no other signs of
whales - saw two sail steering S.W.
Lat 29.30
Long 44.10

Saturday March 29th 1873
All day light baffling winds and squally weather
with some rain - ship steering N.E. by E all day
per compass - saw two or three sail working
to the S.W. - no signs of whales -

Sunday March 30th 1873
All day light baffling winds from the S & E.
and cloudy weather - ship steering to the
N.E. by E all day with all sail out -
nothing in sight all day
Lat 24.01
Long 42.05

Monday March 31st 1873
All day fresh breezes from the S and E and
cloudy weather - ship steering E.N.E. a
part of the day - have experienced a strong
current from the N.E. and are steering up in
order to clear Cape Horn - nothing in sight
all day but one sail steering to the W.
Lat 23.01
Long 39.53

Tuesday March April 1st 1873
All day strong breezes from the S. with squalls
of rain - ship steering N.E. per compass with
all sail out - nothing in sight all day
- no signs of whales - water blue & clear
Lat 20.55
Long 39.54
