

Remarks on Board Ship Adderion

July 6th These twenty four hours commenced with a moderate breeze, all sail set, steering S. wind N.E. at 6 PM the wind hauled about N.W. the middle and latter part much like the first steering W.S.W. employed the latter part in knocking the vessel off the anchors and painting them. so ends Lat - 27° 15' South
Long 169° 09' W

Sat 7th These twenty four hours commenced with a light breeze all sail set steering W.S.W. employed in ship duty, middle part moderate latter squally with rain. the sail in sight steering on the wind course W.S.W. no observation to day. so ends Lat - 26° 00' (41) 77
Long 172° 15' W

Sun 8th These twenty four hours commenced with rain and squally, middle part much the same. at 3 PM spoke the Ship Rambler of N.B. homeward bound. at 10 AM gained with the Rambler. latter part light wind steering to the Southward & Westward. 26 59
172 15

Mon 9th These twenty four hours commenced with a light breeze, all sail set, steering on the wind, gaming with the Ship Rambler. Capt & Mrs Capt Lawrence went on board of the R. middle and latter part much like the first steering S.W. during the latter part of this day, sent down the J. J. I. had stay and sent it up for a main. J. M. Staysail stay, sent up the jib, and bent it for a No 1 Staysail bent another jib, and for Staysail, sent in the old J. M. Staysail, and bent another. so ends these twenty four hours Lat - 24° 30' S
Long 172° 50' W

From Honolulu to New Zealand

Jan 6 1860

Tues 10th These twenty four hours commenced with a light air course S.W. employed to work on the sails, the Ship Rambler is about three miles distant of our starboard beam middle part steering S.W. middle and latter part nearly calms, the Cooper employed in setting up shooks. so ends Lat - 27° 52' S
Long 173° W

Wed 11th This day commenced with a light air steering S.W. wind about N.W. employed in making spungarn middle and latter part much like the first part. so ends Lat - 28° 00' S
Long 173° 30' W

Thurs 12th These twenty four hours commenced with a gentle breeze, employed in ship duty on the 11th bent a main staysail on sail in sight (the Rambler) middle and latter Lat - 28° 12' S
Long 174° 20' W

July 13th These twenty four hours commenced with a light air, saw the Ship Rambler have the three boats down (probably after black fish) Lat 14 middle part middle and latter part much like the first latter part moderate breeze, employed the latter part bathing out fresh water. 29 04 17633

Sat 14th This is Saturday the 14th instead of July 13th for I have made a mistake of one day during this week. Lat - 29° 09' S
Long 178° 20' W

Sun 15th These twenty four hours commenced with a moderate breeze, steering W.S.W. wind S.E. all sail set. at 5 PM gained with the Rambler. Capt Willis & W. H.
