

- J⁶ Strong breeze with rain saw four sails all well so ends the day
 J⁸ Strong breeze saw three sails so ends the day
 S⁸ Light winds with some rain saw six sails lowered for a humpback but did not strike all well so ends the day
 S⁹ Strong breeze nothing in sight so ends the day
 M¹⁰ Fine light wind saw one sail so ends the day
 J¹¹ do do saw three sails so ends the day
 W¹² Fine with light wind saw one sail broke out the lower hold and covered the head and floor
 J¹³ Fine with light wind nothing in sight
 J¹⁴ Fine with light wind saw two sails
 S¹⁵ Fine with light wind forepart - latter part strong breeze and squalls furlled fore and main top sails and closed reefed the main saw 1 sail
 S¹⁶ Strong breeze with squalls saw one sail
 M¹⁷ the same saw four sails
 J¹⁸ the same saw nothing
 W¹⁹ the same saw nothing
 J²⁰ the same saw nothing
 J²¹ Strong breeze saw one sail so ends the day
 S²² Strong breeze nothing in sight so ends the day
 S²³ Strong breeze nothing in sight
 M²⁴ Light breeze steering S. S. E. raised one sail and furlled the spare boats and stood whole watches at night
 J²⁵ Light breeze and calm nothing in sight - lowered and caught two turtles and I had a back tooth broken by the masts rollers
 W²⁶ Strong breeze and squalls double reefed the top sails nothing in sight
 J²⁷ Strong breeze nothing in sight

- J²⁸ strong ~~the~~ gale from the N. run S. E. 1 until two o'clock took in sail and hoisted nothing in sight stood quarter watches at night
 S²⁹ light wind saw one whale going to the windward
 S³⁰ light winds with nothing in sight but finbacks
 October 1st 1848 Commence with light winds saw upright whale for once and one finback
 J² Commence with light winds and calm raised a upright whale at 6 o'clock at 10 and lowered but did not strike lat 35° 3' S long 26° 3' W lowered again at 3 o'clock P.M. but they turned out to be humpbacks so ends the day
 W³ Calm and clear with nothing in sight but finbacks so ends the day
 J⁴ Fine with light winds saw whales on the lee beam and ran off for them but made them out to be humpbacks so ends the day
 J⁵ Strong gale with rain took in sails and rose to all hands engaged in catching water
 S⁶ Light winds with thick fog and nothing in sight
 S⁷ Light winds with thick fog steering S. S. E. stood whole watches at night
 M⁸ Commence with light winds in the fore part but increases to a gale in the latter part took in sail at night and hoisted under close reefed main top sail and fore topmast stay sail stood quarter watches
 J⁹ the gale continues reefed and set the fore sail and close mizen gale moderates at night
 W¹⁰ Commence with strong breeze the fore part made sail at daylight saw a large whale on the lee beam blowing and turning flukes soon called it a sperm whale but did not see him after he went down stood whole watches steering S. by E lat 36. 7 long 22. 20 W
 J¹¹ Fine with light wind from the W. steering S. by E saw a party of finbacks in sight - lowered for a upright whale but turned out to be a humpback took in sail at night and quarter watches
