

- 12 heavy gale from the W laid to until 10 o'clock
 P.M. when we made for the S.W. and set the
 fore and main top sails and fore sail run off
 until four o'clock. P.M. luffed to again and took
 in sail as end the day
- S 13 Strong gale from the W laid to until 10 o'clock
 when the wind hauled to the S.W. and moderate
 set the fore and main top sails. Took them
 in at sunset as end the day
- S 14 Strong breeze from the S saw two finbacks
- S 15 Strong breeze from the S nothing in sight
- S 16 Commenced with light winds forepart but
 increased to a strong breeze double reefed the
 top sails at two o'clock P.M. and furlled the
 main sail nothing in sight
- W 17 Strong breeze with fog saw finbacks
- W 18 Fine with baffling winds nothing in sight
- S 19 Strong breeze saw a sail at day light
 on the weather bow and double reefed the
 top sails at 7 o'clock P.M.
- S 20 Strong breeze set the double reefed top sails
 at day light but took them in at 10 o'clock
 and hove to with a moderate gale from the S.W.
- S 21 Commenced with calm and thick fog but breeze
 on at latter part fog the same
- S 22 Commenced with strong breeze struck a porpoise
 but lost him breeze freshened at latter part
 nothing in sight
- S 23 Commenced with moderate gale and continued so
 through the day nothing in sight
- W 24 Commenced with strong gale and heavy rain
 clear at night with light winds
- S 25 Light breeze with nothing in sight
- S 26 Fine with light winds nothing in sight
 but finbacks so ends the day
- S 27 Dead calm with nothing in sight
- S 28 Dead calm with nothing in sight but

- 17 Commenced with light breeze and fog I raised
 a school of sperm whales at eight A.M. and
 lowered and the waist boat struck and got one
 small one and the rest of the boat chased them
 about fifteen miles to the windward but did
 not get them got on board at two P.M. and cut in
 the whales and commenced tying out and took in sail
 at night so ends the day
- 18 Commenced with light breeze and foggy with nothing
 in sight but finbacks got through foggy out at sunset
 P.M. and washed off the ship with the turned up
- W 19 Commenced with light breeze saw one sail and
 nothing more strove down our oil after dinner
 and stood whole watches at night turning East
- S 20 Commenced with light breeze and calm saw three
 right whales at 9 A.M. and lowered and chased them
 three hours and I went on and had a good chance
 but missed him and the starboard boat struck
 a blackfish and got turned over and lost him
 and I raised another whale at two P.M. and lowered but
 turned out to be a finback and so I raised another
 right whale at five P.M. and lowered and the B went on
 and parted but did not faster and the Bow Boat
 went on and struck a large cow with a calf and
 got her along side at eleven o'clock at night and
 took in sail the first whale was raised by J. Chapman
- S 21 Commenced with light breeze and increased to a
 strong one I Chapman raised some right whales at
 one P.M. and lowered with no success and saw them
 again at 9 P.M. and lowered with the same luck
 but we cut in the whale and got through at 12
 and commenced tying out broke out some new pipe
 shanks after dinner so ends the day saw two sails
- S 22 Commenced with strong breeze with nothing in sight
 with all hand engaged in tying out
- S 23 Commenced moderate gale the second mate water raised
 right whales at half past five A.M. but did not lower
 on account of the sea and got through tying out
 at one P.M. and had 10 barrels turned up and J. Johnson
 raised more whales at four P.M. off deck
- 16 24 Commenced with good breeze saw a right whale raised
 by the 2 mate and lowered and the waist boat went
 on and struck slightly but the iron drewed and lost
 him and Andrew Foxent raised another at half
 past one P.M. and lowered and the larboard struck
 him and he sunk so that we lost him
