

23 Commences with strong breeze and a dead whale at half past eleven took him along side at twelve and after dinner and commenced trying out at dark I expect that it is one of the whales that were of spouting blood from the last whale he was dally killed and stunk bad

Commences with strong breeze and rain in the forenoon but cleared up at nine o'clock and made sail and kept on our course again with nothing in sight

Commences with light breeze and clear with nothing in sight struck a porpoise and got him after dark

Commences with light breeze and clear with nothing in sight showed down the side 16 bells of it and took out and cooped some of our meat

Commences with light breeze with nothing in sight all hands engaged at setting up water shoes nine months out today

Commences with light breeze with nothing in sight all hands engaged at setting up shoes

Thursday March 11 1850 at 9 o'clock out 1050 of oil Commences with light breeze with fog from the weather beam and a shoal of kelp on the starboard all hands engaged setting up shoes and making last sails

Commences with light and baffling breeze and fog with nothing in sight

Commences with light breeze and nothing in sight engaged at setting up shoes

Commences with light baffling breeze with nothing in sight and ends the day

Commences with light breeze from the W saw two spouts on the starboard bow but nothing more

Commences with light breeze and calm at night finished setting up water shoes

Commences with light breeze in the morning and saw a whale one rising and sailed ahead but saw nothing more of him dead away sailing

Light winds and calm with nothing in sight went to the mainmast and mended it

Strong breeze from the E with nothing in sight but porpoises

Commences with light breeze and increased to a strong one with nothing in sight

Commences with light breeze and increased to a strong one with nothing in sight

Commences with light breeze and increased to a strong one saw three sails and spoke the Florida of New Bedford left March 16 months out 600 Tons with her bound to King Seagor Sound grained with her until dark

Commences with strong breeze saw the Florida on the starboard raised the land at six o'clock and kept off S.E.

Commences with strong breeze run in to anchor in King George Sound at one o'clock and the Florida came in at four o'clock and went ashore with a boat with the Capt to get recruits

Harbor Journal

Sent the Starboard watch ashore on liberty and scrubbed the ship for painting one man

Sent the other watch ashore and took the anchor twice and tried to get into the inner harbor but had to come to for want of wind

got the ship underway in the morning and moved in to the anchorage and helped tow the Florida in and tarred down the rigging after dinner

Sent the Starboard watch on liberty and did nothing more

Sent the Starboard watch on liberty and painted the bows

kept all hands on board and got off a raft of water and painted the Starboard side

kept all hands and got off the remainder of our water and two boat loads of wood

Set a watch ashore and stowed down the remainder of the wood and water

Sent the watch ashore and painted some on the Starboard side and had to give it up on account of rain

kept all hands on board and finished painting and got off two boat loads of wood

Took our anchor and put to sea after lying in port ten days and got one sheep one half of a bullock and four bags of potatoes

a long came in while we were getting underway and another ship coming up the Sound the Florida came out after us saw a hump back at sunset

Commences with strong breeze saw the Florida on the weather beam and two fish
