

8th To day we had a strong breeze all day at nine A.M. for a wright whale we raised two more at eleven A.M. and the W. got a large bull and got him alongside at three P.M. and cut him and stood quarter watches at the Emma C. Jones was in sight all day and the Lige we saw yesterday, the Emma was looking for whales were raised by the mate and the last by J. Chapman.

9th To day we had a strong gale all day with rain until 12 o'clock when it cleared up so that we started the works. saw the big on our lee and Henry turned raised two wright whales at half past five A.M. so ends the day did not lower.

10th To day we had a strong gale all day saw some whales but did not see what they were. kept the works going all day but cooled down at night on account of the sea so ends the day.

11th To day we had a moderate gale all day with a heavy sea running started the works in the morning and got through at ten P.M. and cooled down saw nothing but finbacks so ends the day.

12th To day we had a light breeze and calm all day saw some wright whales at half past three P.M. and lowered with no success so ends the day.

13th To day we had a strong breeze all day showed down the whole in the forenoon and Christian De George raised two wright whales and lowered one boat but they went to the windward to start lowered half past eleven A.M. so ends the day 15 lbs.

14th To day we had light winds and thick fog all day and nothing but finbacks and porpoises lay under short sail all day.

15th To day we had light breeze and calm all day with a thick fog cleared up between three and four P.M. and J. Chapman raised three wright whales and we lowered with no success so ends the day had to all day under short sail.

16th To day we had a strong gale all day with fog and rain saw nothing so ends the day.

17th To day we are in light breeze and calm with a moderate fog and rain all day and nothing.

18th To day we had a moderate gale all day with nothing in sight lay for all day under short sail.

19th To day we had a strong breeze all day saw a wright whale at four P.M. raised from deck by the mate lowered with no success saw a bale at six P.M. on the weather beam so ends the day.

20th To day we had a steady breeze all day saw a wright whale we called the Emma C. Jones in sight all day and saw more that we raised at nine A.M. on the weather beam saw some finbacks and faced nothing more.

21st December 1850 To day we had a steady breeze all day saw some porpoises and black fish at half past one saw some finbacks in evening of the and the Emma was in sight all day.

22nd To day we had a strong breeze all day I raised two wright whales at seven A.M. and lowered them. The wright boat and struck a small cow and we went on and struck a large bull and got him alongside at noon and got down and cut him in and took in sails at sunset the Emma was in sight nearly all day.

23rd To day we had a moderate gale in the morning with rain cooled down after breakfast but it cleared up at eight A.M. and started them again and I raised a wright whale at five P.M. but did not lower being too rough so ends the day.

24th To day we had a moderate gale in the morning but increased in the middle of the day and moderated again towards night saw a large whale at five P.M. tearing to the eastward under easy sail saw some spouts after dark but did not see what they were saying out all day.

25th To day we had a strong breeze all day saw some finbacks in the morning and I raised a wright whale at one P.M. and the Emma was in sight all day and saw some whales we were in chase broke out and ran down part of our side got through bying out at three P.M.

26th To day we had a light breeze with rain in the morning but cleared off at eight A.M. and died away calm and commenced staving down lowered at eight A.M. for a wright whale but hauled out finback C. De George raised a gang of whales at two P.M. and lowered down and the W. B. struck and got one got him alongside at four P.M. and cut him in.

27th To day we had a light breeze all day all hands engaged in bringing out and stowing down the remainder of our side saw nothing but finbacks.

28th To day we had a good breeze all day saw a plenty of finbacks got through bying out at noon.

29th To day we had a strong gale all day stowed down our side saw nothing counts the day two men died with the dysentery.
