

46 S 8 To day we had a moderate gale in the forenoon but moderated down to a steady breeze and nothing so end the day

S 8 To day we had a light breeze all day and some killing in the forenoon and saw a large white whale at half past three I shot and lowered three boats and the boat struck him and he went under with three lines to him in 60 fms water and they brought the lines to the ship and took them to the bundles and hove him half way up and parted the lines and lost him

46 No 9 To day we had a good breeze all day and saw some spouts at five o'clock but did not make them out

T 11 To day we had a moderate gale and lay to all day with nothing sight

46 W 12 To day we had a strong breeze all day with nothing in sight so ends the day

T 13 To day we had a good breeze all day and saw a big to the leeward during the forenoon showed her colours but could not make her out we saw the boat at day saw one finback and got off the bank before night and saw some small caught a crabfish

T 14 To day we had a good breeze all day and steered to the eastward all day saw two finbacks and some porpoises so ends the day

S 15 To day we had a light breeze all day with calm saw nothing but one finback and some killing

S 16 To day we had a light breeze all day and calm all night saw grasshoppers and killing a plenty and one finback so ends the day

46 No 17 To day we had a calm all day saw a plenty of grasshoppers and killing and some finbacks

T 18 To day we had a light breeze all day saw a plenty of finbacks and some porpoises and got on the beach at noon and took in the line in 50 fms water

W 19 To day we had a strong breeze all day with nothing in sight so ends the day

T 20 To day we had a moderate gale all day and saw some spouts to the N E so ends the day

T 21 To day we had a strong gale all day with nothing in sight so ends the day 47

S 22 To day we had a strong breeze in the forenoon but died away after dinner kept away E & E at one o'clock and raised a ship a sight at 10 o'clock and bore up and spoke her and found it to be the Emma of Jones of New Bedford 14 mts out 2000 lbs in all 1000 lb from the eastward laid by her all day and landed her a fine 5 lb to gun saw nothing more so ends the day

S 23 To day we had good breeze all day saw the Emma on the weather bow but nothing more split the main top sail in a squall before breakfast

46 No 24 To day we had a strong breeze all day and kept away at ten o'clock to the N E and stood while watches at night saw nothing

T 25 To day we had a strong breeze all day saw a plenty of finbacks but nothing more so ends the day

W 26 To day we had a moderate gale from the N E all day steering N E under double reefed top sail all day took in sail at night and stood quarter watch off river De Solate

T 27 To day we had strong breeze from the N E all day running to the N E all day took in sail at night saw a large creek in the water that looked like a lake but did not lower boat

F 28 To day we had a good breeze in the morning but died down to a light one at night saw nothing

S 29 To day we had a light air in the morning but increased to a southerly at 10 o'clock breeze at night took whole watches saw nothing

S 30 To day we had a strong breeze all day saw nothing besides E & E so ends the day

46 No 31 To day we had a light breeze from the S mounted the main top sail at three o'clock 8 o'clock the Emma and spoke large whales lowered four boats and the Emma struck and capsized and got her along side at dark Lat 38.25 Long 46.00

April 5. 1857 To day we had a light breeze all day commenced cutting at six o'clock and got through a half past eight 8 o'clock put the saoper raised a whale of large whales at ten o'clock and lowered the first and four boats with an anchor commenced trying out at ten o'clock
