Humphrey Shearman Master
Sunday March 15th 1840
Fore part strong breeze from N at 3 P.M. took
the whale along side employed in boiling at 11
commenced raining. Latter part Foggy employed in
boiling & no Lat to Day

Monday March 16th 1840
Fore part light breeze from N and suggested
at commenced cutting the whale at 7 A.M. finish
at 9 P.M. commenced boiling at 12 A.M. down
a brisk gale latter part the same Lat 45.28
Long 176.30

Tuesday March 17th 1840
Fore part a brisk gale at 4 P.M. moderate commenced
boiling saw a right whale and one ship Middle
and latter part light breeze from S.W. and pleasant
weather employed in boiling at 6 A.M. commenced stowing
down Oil Lat 45.03 Long 176.30

Wednesday March 18th 1840
Fore part light breeze from N. Shoring by the wind to N
fine pleasant weather employed in boiling and stowing
Down Oil Middle part strong breeze at 1 P.M.
finish boiling latter part brisk gale heading to E
saw 2 ships to the S Lat 45.28 Long 176.50

Thursday March 19th 1840
Fore part brisk from N and strong heading to Eastward
under fore reef Main top-sail Middle and latter part
strong breeze at 6 A.M. commenced stowing down
oil Lat 45.48 Long 177.20

Friday March 20th 1840
Fore part strong breeze from N heading to the
N Middle part brisk gale latter part the same
saw several Whales at 10 A.M. hoard our boats
and galled Lat 46.05 Long 176.50

Saturday March 21st 1840
Fore part brisk gale from S.W. shoring by the wind to
Westward and fair weather Middle and latter part
the same Lat 45.39 Long 176.40

Sunday March 22nd 1840
Fore part brisk gale from S.W. at 1 P.M. more mod-
erate saw several right Whales hoard our boats but
without success Middle part light breeze at 6 A.M.
saw several right Whales hoard our boats hoard
boat struck and killed latter part calm Lat 45.10
Long 176.15

Monday March 23rd 1840
Fore part light breeze from N at 3 P.M. took the
whale along side at 4 commenced cutting at
7 P.M. finished cutting Middle part light breeze
at 5 A.M. the wind from E.N.E. at 8 A.M. saw 3 right
Whales hoard our boats at 11 A.M. hoard boat struck
latter part strong breeze and squally Lat 46.00

Tuesday March 24th 1840
Fore part strong breeze from E.N.E. at 3 P.M. took the
the whale along side at 3 commenced cutting at 8
finished Middle part strong breeze heading to S.E. latter
part a fine breeze and pleasant weather heading
to N employed in boiling Lat 45.46

Wednesday March 25th 1840
Fore part a brisk breeze from E.N.E. heading to N employ
in boiling Middle and latter part light breeze from
E and light squalls of rain at 6 A.M. saw a right
hoard our boats and galled saw 2 ships to E. with hands
employed in boiling Lat Long
