voyage Humphrey Thurston Master

Thursday July 8th 1840

All this day a fine breeze from E and pleasant
weather employed in sundry jobs

Friday July 10th 1840

Fore part strong breeze from SE and very
rather part fine pleasant weather employed
in hauling the ship to stop A leak

Saturday July 11th 1840

All this day light breeze from SE and
pleasant weather employed in working
ship and blacking the keel

Sunday July 12th 1840

All this day light breeze from SE and pleasant
weather one watch on liberty so ends

Monday July 13th 1840

All this day light breezes from SE to S
all hands employed stowing water and
getting wood

Tuesday July 14th 1840

All this day light breeze and calm employed
in getting wood and water and other
sundry jobs

Wednesday July 15th 1840

Commenced with calm rather part light
breeze employed in sundry jobs

Thursday July 16th 1840

Fore part strong breeze from SE and pleasant
weather employed in fitting the penants
rather part employed in painting ship at
7 A.M. put Chase A. Seamon in irons pro
involence to the captain at 9 A.M. rather
Boat star took his things and went
fore for misbehavior
