

Remarks on board Bark Cora on Whaling voyage

Sunday November 1st 1840

Fore part strong breeze from S W steering by the wind to S E employed in stowing down oil in the main hatch at 6 P M finished the main hatch way Middle part strong breeze latter part the same employed in stowing oil at 11 P M finished the fore hold Lat 35.06 Long 168.30

Monday Nov 2nd 1840

Fore part strong breeze from S W steering by wind to W N W at 5 P M spoke the Jones of Harver 3500 Middle part calm at 4 A M a brisk breeze from E at 6 A M wore ship to N E Lat 34.39 Long 169.29

Tuesday Nov 3rd 1840

Fore part strong breeze from E N E and blowing steering by the wind to N 5 ship in sight from 10 P M to 9 A M calm latter part a brisk breeze from W S W steering by the wind to N W Lat 34.18 Long 169.10

Wednesday Nov 4th 1840

Fore part strong breeze from W S W steering by the wind to N W at 5 P M saw 2 right whales chased our boats Harbor boat struck waste boat hited at 7 P M took him along side saw 5 ships Middle part strong breeze from N N W and squally at 7 A M wore ship and commenced cutting at 2 A M the Isabella of fair haven 24 months out 1500 at noon finish cutting Lat 33.55 Long 169.10

Thursday Nov 5th 1840

Fore part strong breeze from W at 4 P M commenced boiling at 6 P M wore ship to S W latter part strong breeze employed in boiling on ship in sight Lat 34.19 Long 169.00

Humphrey Tharman MasterFriday Nov 6th 1840

Fore part strong breeze from W N W steering by the wind to S W at 6 P M spoke the Jones of Harver 3500 Middle part calm at 4 A M a brisk breeze from E at 6 A M wore ship to N E Lat 35.00 Long 168.40

Saturday Nov 7th 1840

All this day strong breeze from S W by N to S at 7 A M put out the waste boat and commenced breaking out the After hold to stow oil Lat 35.23 Long 169.30

Sunday Nov 8th 1840

All this day strong gale from W heading to it under lost reef Main topsail at 6 P M finish stowing Lat 35.38 Long 169.00

Monday Nov 9th 1840

Fore part strong gale from W at 9 A M moderated put out the waste boat and wore ship to N W strong breeze from S W our Bark in sight Lat 35.45 Long 168.30

Tuesday Nov 10th 1840

Fore part strong breeze from S W steering by the wind to N W at 3 P M spoke a French Bark at 3 M set the fore topsail and Lib fine pleasant weather at sunset took in the Lib latter part variable weather at 11 A M spoke the Rosalie of Warren 13500 Lat 34.59 Long 167.55

Wednesday Nov 11th 1840

Fore part strong breeze from S W steering by the wind to N W latter part the sun at day light made all sail saw a right Whale round 2 hets and galled at 9 A M wore again for the sun Whale without success Lat 34.10 Long 168.15
