

Barque Vora. September 1841.

22. Thursday Sept 23rd 1841. Commenced with Strong breezes from E. S. E. headed by the wind to the S. & 6 p.m. past a barque steering by the wind to the N. E. Middle part Strong breezes. and variable heading from S. E. to S. W. Latter part Moderate Easterly Ship to the N. E. Noon tacked to the S. E. employed in Ship's duty. 2 Men sick.

Noon Lat^o 37-30 N. Long 35-41 W.

23 Friday Sept 24th Commenced with Moderate breezes from N. E. by E. heading by the wind to S. E. by E. & 3 p.m. set the Main topgallant sail. Middle part Moderate & 2 p.m. wind hauled to N. W. headed to the East. daylight set the Fore topgallant sail and 4th Lib. Latter part Wind N. E. heading E. S. E. employed in Ship's duty. Cooper & one Man Sick.

Noon Lat^o 37-07 N. Long 33-29 W.

24 Saturday Sept 25th Commenced with Moderate breezes from N. E. and pleasant weather. heading E. S. E. by the wind. Middle part the same. Latter part Light breezes from N. W. and pleasant steering E. N. E. employed breaking out and moving between decks. 3 Sails in sight. 3 Men Sick.

Noon Lat^o 37-21 N. Long 32-13 W.

25 Sunday Sept 26th Commenced with Moderate breeze from N. W. and pleasant steering E. S. E. Middle part Strong breeze from the Westward & 1 A.M. took in the Fore & Main topgallant sail. daylight Moderate set the Topgallant sails 3 Men Sick. Hand at Leisure.

Noon Lat^o 38-20 N. Long 29-40 W.

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26 Monday Sept 27th 1841. Commenced with Fresh breezes from N. E. to S. W. steering East & 4 p.m. took in Topgallant Sails Mainsail and Double Reef the Top sails. Hauled up by the wind to S. E. 10 p.m. wore ship to S. W. & 3 A.M. wore ship to S. W. daylight Moderate and heavy made all sail & 6 A.M. saw the Land Wind hauled to N. E. with a Strong breeze took in topgallant sails 1st Mainsail and Double Reef the Top sails saw 3 Ships in shore noon the Middle part of the Island bearing E. S. E. distant 8 Miles Pico bearing S. E. distant 15 Miles.

Noon Lat^o 38-20 N. Long 28-52 W.

27 Tuesday Sept 28th Commenced with Strong breezes from the North & 2 kept off for the Harbour & 5 p.m. got in abreast of the town took off shore spoke the Abeline Gibbs of Fairhaven. also 3 other Ships the Charles W. Morgan of Medford Margaret of Newport and the three Mithills of Nant. & 9 p.m. wore ship in shore & 10 wore off shore. 1 A.M. wore in shore 5 wore off shore & 6 wore in shore daylight the S. E. point bearing N. E. by E. distant 8 Miles & 7 kept off & 8 the boat left the Ship for the shore 2 Ship in sight - Latter part Light air and variable. the Ships Abeline Gibbs of Fairhaven laying off and on for recruits so ends.
