

Bark: Cora. September 1841.

28. Wednesday Sept 29th Commences with light wind from West to S.W. & 1 p.m. the Boat came along side from shore with Potatoes Pumpkins Water Melons Corn Eggs and Cucumbers. & 4 p.m. the Capt. came on board kept off N.E. in company with the Adeline Gibbs until the S.E. Point of Fayal bearing W. S. W. the S.W. Point bearing West distant 8 Miles the West Point of St. George bearing East. & 8 p.m. hauled by the Wind to N.W. with Fresh breezes and Squally Double Reef the Topsails furled the Mainsail and 10 p.m. daylight kept off S.E. by S. Strong breezes and hazy latter part the same & 10 p.m. St. George bearing E. S. E. kept off E. N.W. Point of Graciosa bearing N. N. E. distant 18 Miles

29 Thursday Sept 30th Commences with strong breezes and Squally 3 p.m. saw the Island of Terceira the West Point bearing E. S. E. Wind increasing took in the Foretop sail and Foresail stanch hauled by the Wind to N.W. and at the Foresail daylight kept off S.W. 10 p.m. passed a barque headed to the N.W. & 11 p.m. hauled in under the S.E. shore of Terceira saw 3 frigates and one ship cruising with the Foretop sail and Mainsail employed in ships duty

30 Friday Oct 1st Commences with strong breezes and pleasant. spoke the ship Grand Turk of Madeira 17 Months 1000 lbs Sperm and one Right Whale 2 p.m. made sail sunset the South Part bore W. by S. the North N. N. E. 8 p.m. saw a ship of the South Point headed to the N.W. Middle and latter part Fresh breezes and squally the Grand Turk and one ship in sight Cruising off the Island. Cooper sick with the Ladies Fever.

Barque Cora. October 1841.

31. Saturday Oct 2nd Commences with Moderate breezes and pleasant. Cruising off the S.E. Part of Terceira & 4 p.m. Boarded with the Grand Turk. & William Baker. & 9 p.m. headed to the Eastward daylight headed to the Westward. 2 Ships and one frigate in sight 7 p.m. kept off S.E. the N.E. Part bearing N. W. distant 8 Miles & 9 p.m. the Long. for Ohio 26. 42. 15. the Port of Angra bearing West to compass distant 12 Miles employed in ships duty
Moon Late 38. 33. N. Long 26. 30. W.

32. Sunday Oct 3rd Commences with strong breezes and hazy from P. N. W. 3 p.m. Double Reef the Topsails furled the Mainsail and 10 p.m. hauled up S.W. by S. Middle moved latter part made sail steering S. by W. hands at leisure
Moon Late 36. 27. N. Long 25. 58. W.

33 Monday Oct 4th First Part Moderate and hazy nothing in sight Middle and latter part the same steering S. by W. hands employed in ships duty
Moon Late 34. 05. N. Long 25. 00. W.

34. Tuesday Oct 5th First Part breezes from N. N. W. steering S. by W. & 1 p.m. saw a large Sperm Whale off the Sea bow close aboard lowered 2 Boats without success. having seen the ship & 4 p.m. came on board wore ship to the North saw him 2 boats on the Weather bow 4 p.m. wore ship to the South the Whale off the Sea bow stanch took in sail and hauled the Mountop sail to the mast & 8 p.m. braced forward wore ship to the N. Mainsails wore ship to the S. with the main topsail to the mast & 7 p.m. kept off S. by W. with a strong breeze from the Westward under double reef Topsails
