

Barque. Vera. October 1841.

35. Wednesday Oct 6<sup>th</sup> 1841 Commenced with strong from the West  
Steering S. by W. at 1 p.m. saw a large sperm whale at 3 p.m.  
Lowered 2 Boats the Starboard Boat struck got Capsized  
None the Starboard Boat struck the Whale and saved  
him the Starboard Boat picked up the Crew and Line sail  
took the Boat altogether at 6 p.m. got the Whale along side  
at 10 p.m. parted the Huske Chain got on another at 2 p.m.  
started again at 4 p.m. parted the Chain again got up the  
Starboard Chain Cable and Lashed him Latter part getting  
the Cutting gear ready. strong gale from the Westward.  
Moon Late 33. 24. N. Long 24. 05 W.

36. Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> Commenced with strong winds from the West  
at 1 p.m. Ship commenced Cutting. Cut on side of his  
head at 2 p.m. wore ship. Middle part the same and  
rugged. Daylight wore ship and commenced Cutting very  
rugged. at noon got his head off  
Moon Late 33. 35. Long 23. 20

37. Friday 8<sup>th</sup> Employed Cutting at 9 p.m. finish the Body  
the Carcass got foul of the Boats and parted from it.  
lost it being lodged to lower a boat. set the Mainstay  
sail close reef and the Foretop sail double reef at daylight  
commenced boiling. saw more Whales made sail  
Latter part employed boiling and chasing Whales.  
Moon Late 33. 10. N. Long 23. 40

38. Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> Commenced with Moderate breezes from West  
at 1 p.m. got a new Boat out at 1 p.m. Lowered the Boats without success  
at 3 p.m. came on board. took in sail saw a great many  
scattering Whales Middle and Latter part Moderate breezes  
steering by the Wind to N.E. Cooper sick with the Ladies  
fever  
Moon Late 33. 55. N. Long 23. 50 W.

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39. Sunday Oct 10<sup>th</sup> 1841. Commenced with Light airs from E.S.E.  
and pleasant employed boiling nothing in sight  
Middle part Calm. at 3 p.m. finish boiling and washed  
off Latter part the same. hands at leisure  
Moon Late 33. 05. N. Long 23. 05 W.

40. Monday Oct 11<sup>th</sup> Commenced with calm and pleasant part the  
Steward forward not being fit for the Death part. J. Jones in  
his place at 3 p.m. took a breeze from the Eastward. daylight  
saw a Barque steering to the Westward at 7 p.m. saw 2 vessels  
wore ship to the South made sail saw no more of them Latter  
part employed Coopering  
Moon Late 32. 52. N. Long 23. 12. W.

41. Tuesday Oct 12<sup>th</sup> Commenced with pleasant breezes E.S.E.  
steering by the Wind to S. by W. employed breaking out between  
deck forward and stowing oil at 3 p.m. spoke the Barque  
Mr. A. Hatten. from Liverpool bound to New Orleans.  
Middle and Latter part the same employed stowing & hook  
in the Forepeak. The Cooper on duty.  
Moon Late 31. 31. N. Long 24. 12 W.

42. Wednesday Oct 13<sup>th</sup> Commenced with Moderate breezes and  
pleasant heading by the Wind to S. by W. finish the Fore Whale  
made all sail Middle and Latter part Fresh breezes.  
from E.S.E. employed cleaning ship the man Sick -  
Moon Late 29. 56. N. Long 24. 10 W.

43. Thursday Oct 14<sup>th</sup> Commenced with breezes and squally steering  
S. by W. nothing in sight Middle and Latter part the same  
employed in Ships duty  
Moon Late 28. 25. N. Long 23. 42. W.
