53. Sunday Oct 24<sup>th</sup> 1841. Commences with light trades and pleasant steering for Prava 3 p.m. hauled by the "Hind" to N. N. W. reach the West point of Lago bone S. E. dist 10 miles N. E. point bone S. E. by E. N. W. point of Prava bone S. E. W. S. E. point S. E. W. daylight sight of for Prava 10 A.M. the Capt. left. The Ship for Shore. Laying off and on between Prava and Lago

54. Monday Oct 25<sup>th</sup> Commences with pleasant trades and fair weather, laying off and on. Reach the Capt. returned to the Ship shipped 2 Portuguese sunset N. point of Prava bone W. N. W. dist 5 miles S. point bone S. by W. N. W. S. E. point of Lago S. E. N. E. point E. N. E. Middle part light airs and variable working the Ship clear of Land daylight took a light breeze from N. N. E. steering S. E. W. Prava and Lago in sight

55. Tuesday Oct 25<sup>th</sup> Light trades and pleasant steering to the South reach the North part of Prava bone N. E. by N. dist 25 miles the South point bone N. E. Middle and latter part fresh trades and pleasant employed in Ship's duty

56. Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> Light trades and pleasant steering South 3 p.m. passed a Barque steering to the North of J. A. M. spoke with Swedish Brig St. Olaf. Latter part light trades employed in Ship's duty

From Lat<sup>d</sup> 11.10 N. Long 23 40 W

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57. Thursday Oct 28<sup>th</sup> Commences with light trades and pleasant steering South saw a Brig steering to the North 3 p.m. wind hauled to S. E. with rain Middle part light breezes from North with frequent rain showers Latter part light airs and calm. 2 Barques in sight towed the Boat for Blackfish without success

58. Friday 29<sup>th</sup> Commences with light airs and calm 2 p.m. towed the Boats for Blackfish got 2. 4 Tails in sight light airs and variable Latter part the same heading to the S. E. employed Mincing the Blackfish blubber so ends with one man sick

From Lat<sup>d</sup> 9.40 N. Long 23.08 W

59. Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> Commences with light airs and variable heading to the S. E. 3 Tails in sight Middle part calm Latter part strong breezes from W. to N. E. with rain took in top gallant sails double reefed the Top sails from Moderate made all sail. 2 Barques ahead and one Barque astern all steering to the South

From Lat<sup>d</sup> 8.10 N. Long 22.50 W

60. Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> Commences with moderate breezes from N. E. steering to S. E. employed broiling the Blackfish blubber Middle and latter part light airs from E to S. E. heading to the S. E. spoke with the British Barque Prince of Orange. Bound to Hobart Town. 2 Barques one Ship and 3 Barques in sight quite a flock. One man sick
