

110. Monday Dec 20th 1841. Commenced with light breeze from the N. E. to Calm. Long 2 p.m. from the Sun Obs 51.58.11. Chro 51.10.11. 7 p.m. hauled a boat for a sun fish struck and saved him Middle and Latter part calm both a New Ship Spencer and Main Spencer. So came with 3 Men sick.
Now Lat 40.57 N.

111 Tuesday 21st. Commenced with light breeze from the North. Steering S. W. set the Fore top mast Head sail and Middle part. Strong breeze from N. E. W. took in top gallant sail. Latter part increasing with the top sails turned up the boats set down the Log and Mast. So came with 3 Men sick.
Now Lat 41.42.10 N. Long 54.35.15 W.

112 Wednesday 22nd. Commenced with strong breeze from N. W. and cloudy. 2 p.m. Moderating turned overboard of the top sails. 4 p.m. heavy rains with Thunder and lightning. Put the Cook before the Mast and put the 3 Men sick in his place. Middle part fresh breeze from S. E. heading N. E. W. by the Wind. Latter part Moderating heading West by the Wind. So came 3 Men sick.
Now Lat 43.29 S. Long 56.45 W.

113 Thursday 23rd. Commenced with Moderate breeze from S. E. and Clear. Made all sail. Middle part Strong breeze from N. E. W. doubled up the top sails heading S. E. by the Wind. Latter part Moderate Made all sail.
Now Lat 43.23 S. Long 56.40 W.

114 Friday Dec 24th 1841. Commenced with fresh breeze from West. To 4 p.m. took in top gallant sail. Breeze increasing took in sail. Middle part the same. Latter part Moderating Made sail heading West by the Wind.
Now Lat 43.35 S. Long 57.40 W.

115 Saturday 25th. Commenced with Moderate breeze from S. E. W. Saw a Ship at 4 p.m. boarded with the Ship Harrison Smith of New Bedford. 5 Months out. 1400 lbs. Middle and Latter part the same. The Ship Harrison a head start in the S. E. by the Wind and took the Harbour. Anchor in the deck. So came 3 Men sick.
Now Lat 43.29 S. Long 59.05 W.

116 Sunday 26th. Light airs from East. Weather Moderate. Breeze from N. E. set the Hauling sail. Middle part the same. Latter part the same. Latter part wind hauling to S. W. heading from S. to S. E. took in the Hauling sail. Hands at leisure.
Now Lat 44.25 S. Long 60.30 W.

117 Monday 27th. Strong breeze from S. W. to S. E. W. took in top gallant sail. Doubled up the top sails at 4 p.m. passed a large standing ship S. E. Middle part the same. Daylight strong gale from the S. with heavy squalls. Hove too under close reefed in top sail. Fore top mast, May sail and Spencer. Latter part took in the Waich Boat. So came ship to S. E.
Now Lat 43.35 S. Long 61.51 W.
