123. Sunday Jan. 2nd 1842. Commenced with light breeze from N.E. to N. and hazy steering S. Middle and Latter part the same to end 2 Men sick

124. Monday Jan. 3rd. Light breeze from N.W. and hazy steering S. Middle and Latter part the same employed in ship's duty.

Lat. 49.40 S. Long 62.55 W. Time 63.25

125. Tuesday 4th. Light wind N.W. steering S. Middle and Latter part the same saw finbacks and porpoises

Noon Lat. 51.34 S. Long 64.30 W.

126. Wednesday 5th. Commenced with Moderate breeze from N.W. S. 7 p.m. Haphy S.E. Middle part Fresh breeze from N.W. to N.E. Latter part Strong breeze from West double reef the top sails Noon Moderate Made all sail heading S.E.

127. Thursday 6th. Strong breeze from N.W. steering S by E. 6 p.m. saw Staten Land. Weather Cape Meru bore S by E distant 30 miles Middle part Fresh breeze and squalls from from S.W. heading S.E. by the Wind daylight Cape St. John the easternmost part of Staten Land bore S.E. by S. distant 20 miles Latter part strong wind from S.W. double reef the top sails wore ship to the Westward 11 wore ship to the E.
