

176. Thursday Feb 24th. Light Trades and Pleasant steering

hauled up N.E. Midnight wore ship to S.W. with the
Main top sail to the Mast daylight headed to N.E. and
Made sail the Land in sight employed in ships duty
Soon Lat 15-21 S. Long 75-40 W.

177. Friday Feb 25th. Light breezes and pleasant heading
N.W. along the Land. Bent the Gaff Top sail lowered
a boat to Lance Humpbacks sunset took in sail and
braced up to S.W. 8 p.m. hauled the Main top sail to the
Mast daylight wore ship headed in shore Made sail
saw a Schooner steering to the West. employed in ships duty
The Ankers lowering their heads tops above the Clouds.
Soon Lat 14-30 S. Long 76-20 W.

178. Saturday Feb 26th. Light breezes and pleasant heading
along the Land. Lowered 2 boats for Humpbacks
without success sunset took in sail and headed off to
the Westward daylight Made sail and set the fore top mast
standing sail. Painted the Harbours boat.
Soon Lat 13-55 S. Long 77-20 W.

179. Sunday Feb 27th. Commenced with Pleasant Trades
and fine weather steering N.W. employed in ships
duty sunset took in sail and hauled by the Wind to
S.W. daylight Made sail and Luff off N.W. hands
at leisure
Soon Lat 14-10 S. Long 77-27 W.

181. Monday Feb 28th. Commenced with Pleasant Trades and
fine weather heading to the S.W. by the Wind sunset took
in sail daylight Made sail heading to the S.W. by the Wind
employed in ships duty
Soon Lat 14-38 S. Long 77-42 W.

181. Tuesday March 1st 1842. Commenced with Fresh Trades
and Pleasant 1 p.m. tacked ship to E.N.E. saw for joined
sunset double reef the Top sails daylight Made sail
heading E.N.E. employed squaring the Larboard side
of the Main rigging.
Soon Lat 13-59 S. Long 78-40 W.

182. Wednesday March 2nd. Fresh Trades heading to E.N.E. by
the Wind employed on the Main rigging sunset double reef
the Top sails daylight Made sail employed in ships duty.
9 p.m. passed a Brigg and a Barque steering by the Wind
to S.W.
Soon Lat 13-20 S. Long 78-40 W. 9 p.m.
78-32 W. 11-15 W.

183. Thursday March 3rd. Light Trades and pleasant steering
N.E. finished the Larboard side of the Main rigging sunset
double reef the Top sails Mid night wore ship to the S.W.
with the Main top sail to the Mast daylight Made sail
and wore ship to N.E. Latter part calm and foggy 9 p.m.
saw the Land. employed in getting the Starboard anchor
on the Bow and squaring the Starboard side of the Main
rigging. finished 3 Mens Watters for Taring Manual. Linn
fa. Spelling. Manual for striking Watters with a heavier
Watters 9 Lashes.
Soon Lat 12-50 S. Long 76-46 W.
