

184. Friday March 4<sup>th</sup> Commenced with light breeze from N.W. heading N.W. saw a ship in shore steering N.W. employed on the Starboard side of the Main Rigging. Under took in topgallant sail and headed up N.W. at 8 p.m. hauled the Main topsail to the Mast day light thick fog. with light air wore ship to S.E. at 10 wore ship to S.W. with the Main topsail to the Mast employed cleaning ship and on the Rigging.

185. Saturday March 5<sup>th</sup> Commenced with Light breezes from S.W. and foggy 1 p.m. braced forward to N.E. and made sail at 2 p.m. backed to S.W. at 5 p.m. saw the Land and a sail. wore ship and kept off N.W. by W. Employed as above finish the Starboard side of the Main Rigging. Under took in topgallant sail and braced round heading to the S.W. by the Wind day light set the topgallant sails and wore ship to N.E. by N. with light winds and foggy. at 10 A.M. saw the Land. Employed in ships duty.  
 Noon Lat 12 25 S. Long 77 16 W.

186. Sunday March 6<sup>th</sup> Light breezes and hazy steering N. at 2 p.m. saw the Island of St. Lorenzo at 4 p.m. saw Callao. The Shipping to Anchor and 2 Ships beating up. at 5 wore ship to S.W. by the Wind sunset Lorenzo West. Wind bore N.E. distant 7 miles S.E. point bore E by S. at 7 detached ship to N.E. latter part Light breezes and foggy. The Land in sight saw a ship steering N.W. at 11 back to S.W. St. Lorenzo in sight hauled at leisure  
 Noon Lat 12 19 S. Long 77 12 W.

187. Monday March 7<sup>th</sup> Commenced with Light breezes and hazy. heading N.E. at 3 p.m. wore ship to S.W. one ship in sight. day light heading N.E. at 7 A.M. kept off N.W. by E. The West Point of St. Lorenzo in sight. Employed in ships duty  
 Noon Lat 12 12 S. Long 77 05 W

188. Tuesday March 8<sup>th</sup> Light air from S. at 1 lower a boat to go to Callao for information about the Port of Santo. 2 men left the boat at 2 p.m. Came to Anchor Callao bearing S.E. day light calm under the top sails was visited by the Man of War's boat. at 10 A.M. got under way and came to Anchor abreast of the Town in 5 fathoms water muddy bottom. The Cyane American Sloop of War. Dublin English Frigate one French Frigate of War one Chilianian Frigate and 3 Peruvian Man of War.

189. Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> Light breezes and pleasant Employed in getting Casks ready for water. painted the Decks on the Starboard Side and got off 2 Rafts of Water.

190. Thursday March 10<sup>th</sup> Employed stowing water. The Starboard Hatch on Shore on Liberty sunset all came on board except 3 men sober but the Cook in Town for getting drunk.

191. Friday March 11<sup>th</sup> Day light sent in a raft of Casks for water at 8 A.M. got the Raft on board the Liberty men got on board sober. The Starboard Hatch on Liberty. The President of Peru visited on board the British Frigate Dublin
