222. Monday April 11th Light trades at 3 P.M. kept off N.W. sunset took in sail and haul the maintop sail to the mast daylight made sail and kept off West saw Finbacks.

223. Tuesday April 12th Light trades and pleasant heading N.W. at 3 P.M. lowered the boats for blackfish got nothing sunset haul by the trina to N.E. with the maintop sail to the mast daylight headed West.

224. Wednesday April 13th Light Trades and pleasant steering N.W. by N. sunset kept off West by N. latter part the same saw plenty of Cowfish

Point of Chatham Island bore N.W. 8 P.M. saw Island bore about S.W. by W. daylight the S.W. Point of Chatham bore about N.E. steering in for the Land at 9 A.M. lowered the Starboard to go in shore a fishing
Moon Late 1.54 L. Long 89.48 W.

228. Sunday 17th Commenced with breezes from N.W. to N.W. by E. at 2 P.M. the Boat returned without any to with a Mass of Fish. bent the cables and got the Starboard Anchor of the Bow at 6 P.M. came to Anchor in Stephen's Bay 11 fathoms water Sunday Bottom later part calm at 8 A.M. 2 boats went after Teripin boards.

229. Monday 18th Light breezes and pleasant at 6 P.M. the Starboard Boat returned without any teripin Middle part Light breezes from E with Thunder and rain latter part rainy the Starboard Boat returned with 4 Teripin 8 Men ashore cutting wood at 10 A.M. the Starboard Boat left with 7 Men after teripin
