Nantucket of Nant. and John of N.B. to windward the Vineyard and Washington to seaward & S.W. The weather ships lowered their boats for a sperm whale. The Mops boats struck & got one boat hove. The whale founded and lost him. Middle and Latter part light breeze from E to E.N.E. heading to the S. 5 Ships in sight and the Land

263. Sunday May 22nd. Commenced with light breeze steering S.E. Middle and Latter part light air heading in for the Land. 5 Ships in sight. Nant. and Abington. Albe marle in sight

264 Monday May 23rd. Commenced with light breeze from N.W. steering in for Sea Bay saw 7 Ships in the Bay. Spoke the George and Susan and John Adams of Nant. Middle part calm Latter part light breeze from the N.W. Cruising between Nant. and North Head in the Mouth of the Bay. saw 8 or 9 Ships

265. Tuesday 24th. Commenced with pleasant breeze from N.W. Cruising of the Mouth of Sea Bay, sunset 4 Ships in sight daylight saw 3 Ships. Heading to the North. Noon. Rodons Rock. bore about N. West 10 miles.

266. Wednesday 25th. Commenced with light breeze from E to E.S.E. heading to the N. Spoke the Ship Navigation of Nant. and Champion of Sagertown. Middle and Latter part light air and calm 3 Ships in sight

267. Thursday May 26th. Commenced with light air and calm and heavy 2 Ships in sight Middle part calm Latter part light breeze from N.E. heading E.S.E. one Ship in sight

268 Friday May 27th. Commenced with light air and calm heading ~~heading~~ to the E.S.E. Middle and Latter part the same. My name Island in sight employed squaring the Starboard side of the Fore Riggin

269. Saturday May 28th. Light air and calm sunset. My name Island bore N.W. with 5 miles. Gullpepper Island bore N.E. Middle part calm. Latter part pleasant breeze from E to E.S.E. heading by the wind to S.E. Employed squaring the Starboard side of the Fore Riggin saw Shipbacks

270. Sunday May 29th. Commenced with pleasant breeze from E.S.E. heading S.E. finished the Fore Riggin. Middle part 3 Ships heading to the N. one boiling, day length the Land in sight and one ship boiling heading in for the Land sunset with 3 Ships in sight

271. Monday May 30th. Commenced with light breeze from N.W. heading in for the Land & 5 Ships in sight of shore. 6 Ships in sight sunset Rodons Rock bore N.W. & E. North Head bore S.W. & E. braced with the Ship Vineyard boiling along whole Middle and Latter part light light breeze from N.E. The Land in sight also 4 Ships heading to the N. Employed in ships duty
