

308. Wednesday July 6th All three 24 hour light breeze E & E heading to S.E. by the wind nothing in sight
Noon Lat 1-55 S. Long 90-10 W.

309. Thursday July 7th First part light wind E & E heading S.E. by the wind 10 S.W. tacked ship to N.E. & E. Middle part light breeze with rain latter part light breeze and cloudy heading to E & E by the wind
Noon Lat 1-44 S. Long 91-40 W.

310. Friday July 8th First part standing to the E. sunset wore ship to the West. Middle part to the N.E. Middle part standing to East. Latter part the same. Charles Island in sight
Noon Lat 1-41 S. Long 90-30

311. Saturday July 9th First part standing to N.E. sunset wore ship headed to the N.W. 10 P.M. hauled the main top sail to the mast daylight breeze forward and kept off N.W. 10 P.M. saw a school of sperm whales going quick to the N.E. wore ship to N.E. and lowered 2 boats saw no more of them 11 A.M. the boats returned Charles Island in sight to the N.E.

312. Sunday July 10th First part standing to the N.W. sunset South Head of Bermuda bore N.W. by N. Middle part heading to N.E. by the wind South Head in sight to the N.E.
Noon Lat 1-25 S. Long.

313. Monday July 11th First part heading to the N.W. saw blackfish sunset wore ship to S.W. by the wind 1 P.M. bore N.W. Middle part heading to N.E. Latter part heading to N.W. along shore saw blackfish lowered without success
Noon Lat 00-50 S.

314. Tuesday July 12th First part heading to the N.W. 10 P.M. spoke the Ship Grace & Howard of N.Y. 2400 lbs haul by the wind to S.W. 11 P.M. headed to the E & E daylight North ahead 3 sails in sight latter part fresh breeze heading to the N. for Sea Day.
Noon Lat 10-20 S.

315. Wednesday July 13th First part heading to the Sea Day 1 P.M. spoke the Sloop Pearl of Sippacan had lost a boat and crew by desertion 3 more sails in sight 2 P.M. wore ship heading to N.W. out of the Bay. Middle part standing off and on daylight headed in to the Bay. Saw blackfish lowered the boats much and saved a porpoise. Spoke the Sloop Franklin of N.Y. 36 months out galled standing in to the Bay
Noon Lat 10-20 S.

316. Thursday July 14th First part heading to the N. in company with the Franklin sunset haul off shore Middle part light breeze headed in shore daylight Coronado Rock bore N.W. by E. kept off the schooner and 2 ships in sight
Noon Lat 10-10 N.

317. Friday July 15th First part light breeze heading to the North lowered the boats for blackfish without success. The Rock bore N.W. by N. North Head bore S.E. by E. Middle part heading in shore 4 sails in sight latter part heading to the North lowered for blackfish without success haul by the wind off shore
No Obs.

318. Saturday July 16th First part heading in shore spoke the Ship Rufus of Portsmouth N.H. 1800 lbs. hauled of N.Y. 1800 and General S. of Fair 1000 lbs. sunset headed off shore latter part heading to the N.E. 3 sails in sight heading in for the Bay.
Noon Lat 00-20 S.
