heading to S. W. by the wind plenty of fish backs in sight. I am
sick myself. Noon Lat 6° 27' S. Long 86° 02'.

425 Monday Oct 31st All these 24 hours Moderate Trades
steering S. W. Noon Lat 6° 14' S. Long 86° 52' W.

426 Tuesday Nov 1st All these 24 hours Moderate trades
and cloudy steering S. W. by S. Employed painting the

432 Monday Nov 7th All these 24 hours Fresh trades (7) p.m.
The Capt. returned with 13 Terrapin hauled by the wind to the
S. daylight 2 boats left the ship for shore after Terrapin
passed a ship steering S. W.

433 Tuesday Nov 8th Employed Laying off and on at South
of Broad. 8 p.m. The Capt. returned with 3 Terrapin. Men
aimed on shore having lost one of my boats crew in the
woods sunset found him daylight got something to eat
and left the shore for the ship got about 5 miles from
shore saw nothing of the ship put a boat for shore. our fresh
water all gone and none to be obtained on shore.
