

434 Wednesday Nov 9th. Pulling along shore to the Landing place, saw the ship to seaward of the Head, put the Boat about and set the sail at 3 p.m. got along side and payed our respects to the water Bait kept off N.W. Narks bearing N.W. sunset haul by the wind to S.W. Middle part heading to E.S.E. Latter part steering N.W. between Narks & Albe mark

435 Thursday Nov 10th. First part of these 24 hours Light breeze and pleasant heading down through the passage between Narks and Albe mark sunset Turtle Point bore N.W. dist 4 miles Middle part Light air with calm day light North Head bore N.W. dist 1/2 m. Latter part calm on boat went in to Narks fishing, all the returned with a net of fish saw 12 crabs plenty of Porpoises in the Bay. No Man fish.

436 Friday Nov 11th. First part Light air. saw nothing but porpoises the boat left for Narks after Turtle sunset the boat returned with 2 Turtles North Head bore N.W. dist 1/2 m. Middle part Fresh trades steering to S.W. Latter part steering N.W. the Land in sight Nov 11th Lat 10 S. Long 91-54 W.

437 Saturday Nov 12th. All these 24 hours Fresh Trades and clear at 2 p.m. saw Roanoke Rock sunset the Rock bore East dist 4 miles kept off N.W. 9 p.m. haul by the wind to S.W. with the Main top sail to the mast day light kept off N.W. dist 1/2 m. Latter part. Hyman's Island in sight Nov 12th Lat 11 S. Long 91-54 W.

438 Sunday Nov 13th. All these 24 hours Moderate Trades steering N.W. sunset haul by the wind to S.W. Hyman's Island bore N.W. dist 1/2 m. Middle & Latter part the same Nov 13th Lat 11-16 S. Long 93-03 W.

439 Monday Nov 14th 1842. All these 24 hours Fresh Trades with trapping fog, squalls heading to the S.W. by the wind nothing in sight Nov 14th Lat 10-41 S. Long 95-00 W.

440 Tuesday Nov 15th. All these 24 hours Fresh Trades and pleasant heading to the S.W. by the wind a boy by the name of Looker sick since we left Santa Nov 15th Lat 10-28 S. Long 97-10 W.

441 Wednesday Nov 16th. All these 24 hours Moderate Trades and pleasant heading to the S.W. Nov 16th Lat 10-03 S. Long 98-46 W.

442 Thursday Nov 17th. All these 24 hours Light Trades and pleasant heading to the S.W. Tacking the Starboard Boat Nov 17th Lat 10-28 S. Long 99-51 W.

443 Friday Nov 18th. All these 24 hours Light Trades and pleasant heading to the S.W. Nov 18th Lat 11-15 S. Long 100-30 W.

444 Saturday Nov 19th. All these 24 hours Light Trades heading to the S.W. bent the Main Spanker. Nov 19th Lat 11-43 S. Long 101-47 W.

445 Sunday Nov 20th. All these 24 hours Moderate Trades and pleasant steering to S.W. Nov 20th Lat 12-35 S. Long 102-55 W.

446 Monday Nov 21th. All these 24 hours Fresh Trades with trapping fog, squalls employ mending the fore sail Nov 21th Lat 13-50 S. Long 104-09 W.

447 Tuesday Nov 22th. All these 24 hours Fresh Trades and squally bent the fore sail heading to S.W. Lat 14-48 S. Long 105-10 W.

448 Wednesday 23rd. All these 24 hours Fresh Trades steering S.W. trapped a English Bark heading to the N.E. Nov 23rd Lat 16-00 S. Long 106-10 W.
