

Barque Lay range bound to Salem

Thursday Dec 5<sup>th</sup> Commenced with fresh breezes and fine weather beating up for Salcahuna 16 fathoms made all sail set the cables and got the anchors off the bows and 3 ships bound out

Friday Dec 6<sup>th</sup> Commenced with fresh breezes beating up the Bay 16 fathoms came to anchor in 6 fathoms water. 8 o'clock commenced moving ship to take in oil from the Barre Statesman

Saturday Dec 7<sup>th</sup> Commenced with light air daylight hauled along side of the bark took out of the 7 baskets of bread marked 0 6 Cask Head marked 0 sunset hauled off to our Anchorage

Sunday Dec 8<sup>th</sup> Commenced with light breezes. No work done this day give Liberty to the following men to return to sunset Miller Cunningham Pike Luther Mc The Swackhemore at sunset their were taken to the Goal

Monday Dec 9<sup>th</sup> Commenced with light northerly breezes and heavy rain men still in Goal John Maerston was taking out of the ship for treating from his side one of the Passengers that took her husband by the Capt of the Post and sent to Goal

Tuesday Dec 10<sup>th</sup> Day light hauled along the Statesman the Consul took four men out of Goal employed 5 men from the shore 38 baskets Bread 0 16 Head 0 16 Head

Wednesday Dec 11<sup>th</sup> Day light hauled along side of the Statesman employed men from the shore Miller and Swackhemore came on board from Goal at 10 finish taking in the oil discharged stone ballast for wood later part ends with Strong Cable at 12 o'clock The second anchor 16 baskets B. D. 2 H. 0 9 H. 5

Thursday Dec 12<sup>th</sup> Moderate employed stowing oil in Goal brought on board by the Capt of the Post Discharged 2 Casks 54 0 85. 20 was -

Friday Dec 13<sup>th</sup> Commenced employed stowing oil & finish stowing the oil and provisions

Saturday Dec 14<sup>th</sup> Commenced with light air employed four men from the shore to haul in the Star anchor painting ship put rice and blacking beads and filling water

Sunday Dec 15<sup>th</sup> Fine weather and pleasant 4 men on Liberty sunset all on board except Maerston

Monday Dec 16<sup>th</sup> Light air and fine weather hands employed filling water and mending the Foresail Taylor and Swackhemore sick to Goal

Tuesday Dec 17<sup>th</sup> Light air and fine weather hands employed on the Foresail and bent in Palmer taken out of the ship for debt the Statesman sailed

Wednesday Dec 18<sup>th</sup> Light breezes and fine weather Palmer sent on board by the Capt of the Post Daylight Foresail and made sail put on shore Swackhemore refusing to do duty he wish to go on shore the Consul having gone to Conception could get no certificate the ship being under way and standing out of the Bay from Guineyana bearing S E Wind 6 miles
