Wednesday Jan 1st Commenced with strong breeze from N. to N.E. sunset single reef the top sails Middle part Double reef. Latter part turned one reef out. Thick and cloudy
 From Lat^o 57-40 S. Long 79-57 W.

Thursday 2nd Commenced with Fresh breeze S.W. and cloudy with passing fog. Squalls steering S.E. at boat the main mast sail Middle part the same Latter part Moderate breeze S.W. steering S.E. spoke a French Frigate bound to the North.
 From Lat^o 52-40 S. Long 79-40 W.

Friday 3rd Commenced with Fresh breeze S.W. with rain steering S.E. at 4 p.m. took in the Studding Sails - Royal top Gallant sail & 8 p.m. Double reef the top sails furled the Mainsail and Gaff at 10 p.m. the Barometer stood 28.30. took in the Foretop sail Close reef the main furled the fore sail Midnight took in the main top sail blowing a hurricane Latter part moderating
 From Lat^o 53-49 S. Long 79-58 W.

Saturday 4th Commenced with Fresh breeze from N. to N.W. Made sail steering S.E. sunset let the fore topmast studding sail Middle part the same Latter part Moderate under all sail
 From Lat^o 55-09 S. Long 77-30 W.

Sunday 5th Commenced with Light breeze S.W. steering S.E. sunset saw a ship heading to the S.W. Middle part the same at 4 p.m. spoke the ship Wisconsin of Sag Harbour 3 Months out no oil signified with a ship the signal W.B. Red banner From Lat^o 56-10 S. Long 74-57 W.

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Monday 6th Commenced with Light breeze S.W. steering S.E. Middle part the same Latter part thick with fog steering S.E. under all sail
 From Lat^o 56-50 S. Long 72-30 W.

Tuesday 7th Commenced with Moderate breeze steering S.E. under all sail Middle part the same at 4 p.m. steering N.E. at 9 p.m. N.E. at 10 p.m. saw the Island Diego Ramirez bearing N. from they bore N.W. N.
 From Lat^o 56-50 S. Long 68-50 W.

Wednesday 8th Commenced with Moderate breeze and pleasant steering N.E. at 6 p.m. saw Hermite Island one of Cape Horns Islands bearing N.W. at sunset saw a ship steering to N.E. at day light the Land in sight from the S.W. Point of Staten Land in sight to the Eastward steering N.E. light breeze S.W. and pleasant weather.
 From Lat^o 55-46 S. Long 65-50 W.

Thursday 9th Commenced with Light breeze S.W. and pleasant steering N.E. at 3 p.m. the wind hauled to N.W. took in the studding sails and haul by the wind E by N. Staten Land in sight. Middle part Fresh breeze S.W. Latter part Moderate breeze and cloudy.
 From Lat^o 54-46 S. Long 61-10 W.

Friday 10th Commenced with Light breeze S.W. steering S.E. Middle part light air and calm. Latter part the same. From Lat^o 54-06 S. Long 59-50 West.

Saturday 11th Commenced with Light breeze S.W. steering S.E. at 4 p.m. saw the Island of Beanehines bearing N.W. Latter part light air and calm. From the Island bore S.W. by S.
 From Lat^o 53-54 S. Long 58-40 West.
