

Tuesday July 4th Commenced with Strong S.E. breeze at N.E. heading
to S.E. Middle and latter part the same Noon 10th 18

Wednesday July 5th Commenced with Strong S.E. breeze at N.E. and
Squally S.W. the wind hauls to the West by N.E. Close
up the foremast and set it reefed sail. Night heavy squalls
Latter part moderating made all sail steering N.E.
Noon Lat^o 25-41 S. Longth 34-19 W.

Thursday July 6th Commenced with Moderate breeze
at N.E. heading to S.E. and then hauls to the N.
Steering by the N.E. Middle and latter part light breeze
Noon Lat^o 24-45 S. Longth 35-29 W.

Friday July 7th Commenced with light breeze at
N.E. heading to S.E. Middle part fresh breeze
and squally S.W. in the night and latter part fresh
breeze at N.E. heading to S.E. Noon Lat^o 24-31 S. Longth 36-09 W.

Saturday July 8th Commenced with fresh breeze at N.E. heading
to S.E. and 4 p.m. Strong breeze and squally Double reefed the foremast
and further the mainmast Middle part the same with rain
Latter part light breeze from S.W. with rain
Noon 10th 18

Sunday July 9th Commenced with fresh breeze and squally
from E. and S.E. with rain Middle part the same latter part
heading S.W. with rain and light clear up. heading from E. and S.E.
Lat^o 23-54 S. Longth 30-56 W.

Monday July 10th Commenced with fresh breeze and clear
heading E. and S.E. Middle part light breeze heading E. and S.E.
Latter part back to the N.
Noon Lat^o 23-36 S. Longth 30-16 W.

Tuesday July 11th Commenced with light breeze at E. and clear
heading N.E. and S.E. Swift one of the passengers put on board by
Mr. Consul at Valparaiso abused the state and made a most
disgraceful manner which no man that called himself a gentleman
man would have done. I went to stop him he took up one of
the sailors sharp knives and swore he would take my life or any
other man on board the ship that would put these hands on him.
The sailors name that owned the knife was at too he puting a
new mouth coat on the main mast. Mr. See. he asked me
any of us to put him in bonds. At 8 p.m. he commenced again with
his abuse to me I told him if he would not behave himself
as he had ought to do that I would not have him in the cabin
with that he took his cloths and went forward Middle part
light breeze heading N.E. and S.E. latter part the same with rain
squalls. At 10 p.m. Swift walking the deck with his open knife
in his hand Noon Lat^o 22-30 S. Longth 30-15 W.

Wednesday July 12th Commenced with light breeze at E. with
passing rain squalls. heading from N.E. and S.E. Middle part headed
to S.E. and S.W. with light breeze found a strong westerly current
Latter part the same Noon Lat^o 21-36 S. Longth 30-45 W.
Chas 30-30

Thursday July 13th All these 24 hours light breeze heading
from S.E. to S.W. Noon Lat^o 21-30 S. Longth 30-15 W.
Chas 30-15

Friday July 14th All these 24 hours light breeze and calm
heading to the S.E. and E. Noon Lat^o 22-11 S. Longth 30-40 W.
Long Lunar 29-50 W. Chas 29-40 W.

Saturday July 15th All these 24 hours light breeze from E. and S.E.
at 1 p.m. hauls to the N.E. and S.E. heading to the East and
Noon Lat^o 22-49 S. Longth 30-40 W. Chas 22-51 W.
