

Remarks Pass On Board Ship Cornithian

14 Monday 19th Come with light gales from the N.W. steering E. S. E. a few passing rain squalls. Main and Latter part fine wind from the N.W. steering E. S. E. - pleasant weather some rain by the break of clouds sick off duty see nothing set up for Royal yet Lat 37:00 N Long 34:24 W

15 Tuesday 20th Come with light wind from N.W. broke out steering E. S. E. the ship under all sail nothing in sight a few passing rain squalls. Main part the same Latter part fine wind from the N.W. some Chuback in sight & some Booby steering E. S. E. Lat 36:45 N

16 Wednesday 21st Come with fresh wind from the N. S. W. steering E. S. E. some rain and unpleasant Main and Latter part fine wind from the N. and S. W. steering E. S. E. by a few passing rain squalls Lat 34:55 N Long 29:45 W

17 Thursday 22nd Come with fresh wind from the N. with squalls of rain and some thunder and broke out Lightning at 3 P.M. took in the light sails for water. Main and Latter light wind from the N. to S. W. steering E. S. E. a few passing rain squalls nothing in sight Lat 33:24 N Long 25:16 W

18 Friday 23rd Come with light wind from N. to S. W. steering E. S. E. a few passing rain squalls. Middle part fresh wind from the S. W. the ship on the Land and Easton tack Latter part squalls and wind from the S. and S. W. very unpleasant the ship under double Reef top sails fresh squalls no sun

On Her Passage Out 1866

19 Saturday 24th Come with light gales from S. to S. W. the ship under double Reef Top sails with heavy squalls. Main and Latter part light gales from the S. S. W. the ship on different tacks with fresh squalls Lat 32:32 N Long 22:16 W

20 Sunday 25th Come with light gales from the S. S. W. steering on the Weston tack some rain squalls the ship under double Reef Top sails Main part fresh gales from S. and rain at midnight the wind moderated and shifted to the S. W. and N. more ship to the S. ward and set the Fore sail Latter part light gales from N. S. W. and fresh squalls and unpleasant weather the ship on the S. ward tack

21 Monday 26th Come with light gales from the S. W. and a few rain squalls and unpleasant weather. Main part the same Latter part light wind see 2 ships from the S. S. W. and fine Pleasant weather a few passing rain squalls Lat 30:50 N Long 20:00 W

22 Tuesday 27th Come with light wind from the S. S. W. and cloudy the ship on different tacks saw 4 vessels bound Southward. Main part fresh wind with rain caught from S. S. W. Latter part light air and calm and cloudy no sun

23 Wednesday 28th Come with light wind from S. S. W. steering E. S. W. under all sail at 4 P.M. fresh wind from the E. steering S. W. by S. Main broke out part light wind from the E. to S. E. the ship on the Land and Weston tack the watch employed in breaking out fore Hatch way Pleasant Lat 28:24 N
