- 24 Thursday 29th Come with light wind from the S E and Pleasant weather the ship on the Sand Weston tack the watch employed in various see for Gobs Miacs and Latter part wind from backd 8 the S E and South and flower very much 3 ships saw 2 ships and a number of fine backd the broke out watch employed in breaking out the Alex Hatt for Broad Pleasant weather Lat 26° 23' N Long 23° 03' W
- 25 Friday 30th Come with light wind from the broke out S. E. to S the ship on the Sand Weston tack for Miacs and Latter part light air from water E S E to S E steering S N by S saw 3 ships caught steering the same course fine pleasant weather 11 dolphin a plenty of Dolphin around the ship Lat 25° 34' N Long 22° 20' W
- 26 Saturday 1st Come with light air from the S E the ship on the South and Weston tack 2 sail in sight steering to the South and westward fine pleasant weather Miacs part light wind from the N steering S N by S Latter part the same at 7 A M exchanged signals with a English Steam Ship of War Lat 10 A M hour 3 Boats for Blackfish but could not catch them 2 ships in sight Lat 26° 27' N
- 27 Sunday 2nd Come with fine breeze from the N steering S N by S by compass and pleasant weather Miacs and Latter part the same Blackfish saw Blackfish and 3 ships Lat 22° 00' N Long 24° 00' W

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- 28 Monday 3rd Come with light breeze from the N E steering S N by S saw a number of fine backd and 3 sails Miacs and Latter part the same Lat 19° 50' N Long 24° 20' W
- 29 Tuesday 4th Come with fine breeze from N E and S E by E at 2 P M exchanged signals with a English Bk. Middle part light wind from the E S E at mid night passed a Barque saw the steering to S N by S Latter part light air and Land calms from E to N E at daylight raised the St. Antonio Lamp of St. Antonio bearing S S W distant 20 Leagues saw 2 ships steering S N Lat 17° 46' N Long 25° 14' W
- 30 Wednesday 5th Come with light breeze from the N E and fine weather at 5 P M a whirl wind which wind passed close to the Stern of the ship at sunset saw the S N end of St. Antonio Island bore S S W 1/2 N distant 9 Leagues Miacs part light air steady and calms Latter part fine wind from the Miacs E N E steering S by N 14 sails in sight bore Southward Lat 15° 37' N Long 25° 40' W
- 31 Thursday 6th Come with fine breeze from E steering S by N Pleasant weather Miacs part the same at 5 A M spoke a English Ship from the West Coast of Africa Bound to Liverpool Latter part fine breeze from E N E saw 3 ships Bound Southward Lat 12° 32' N Long 25° 32' W
