N.E. some more ship to the S.E. with fresh squalls of Hail bound N. Middle part the same Latter part wind S.W. the ship on the North and Westward Cape Horn tack at 11 A.M. more ship to the S.E. in Island handy with the Land the Island of Cape Horn bearing N.W. distant 10 miles Lat 55:56 S
- 78 Tuesday 22nd Come with fresh wind from S.W. and rain S.W. at 4 P.M. the wind S.W. and blowing a Gale the Island of Cape Horn bearing N.W. distant 20 miles the Island ship must storm sails on opposite tack in sight Middle and Latter part fresh gales from S.W. and some heavy squalls of rain Lat 55:55 S
- 79 Wednesday 23rd Come with fresh gales from Cape Horn S.W. and a fresh squalls of rain the ship on opposite tack under close reef top sails Middle part moderated some rain Latter part light wind and calmed from S.W. and steering S.W. plenty of rain saw none sail Eastward Bound the Brumetier say Low 28th Lat 56:30 S Long 67:26 W
- 80 Thursday 24th Come with fair wind from the Cape Horn N. and clear Cape Horn Island bearing N.W. at 3 P.M. steering S.W. a heavy swell from the S.W. the S.W. ship under all sail Middle part light wind from N the ship on Southern saw some tack some wind and clouds weather Latter part ship carrying five breeze from N.W. N.W. S.W. the ship on the S.E. Land Westward tack clear weather Lat 57:40 S Long 68:39 W
