Main Mace and Latter part light wind remaining from NE to NW and some rain squalls Main Royal ship on opposite tack the watch at st the employed in repairing Main Royal and Main Mast filling Main Mast sail. Lat 29:37 N Long 163:43 W

170 Thursday 25th Bore with light wind from out up the Northward the ship on the Westward M. Royal tack under all sail Mace part light wind from the N N W and N W the ship filled on opposite tack Latter part fresh wind a Bullcock from N to N W and some fresh rain at the watch employed in various Main stay Jobs set up the Main stay no sun

171 Friday 26th Bore with fresh wind from the water the North at 3 P.M. more ship to the North employed and westward the weather was equally in shinning and unpleasant Mace and Latter part a Bullcock fresh wind from the N to N W by N a few and getting passing rain squalls the ship on the Westward tack the watch employed various Jobs and halting up the ship chain Lat 30:36 N Long 165:23 W

172 Saturday 27th Bore with fresh wind from the N and N W the ship on the Westward tack for the watch employed in filling the Oil Tank and chain Lockers Mace and Latter part bent at the same the watch employed in Repairing the Main Mace and budding a New Main Spence- Spence it a cloudy overcast Lat 31:11 N

174 Monday 29th Bore with fine wind from the N N E the ship on the Northward and Westward a Bullcock tack under all sail at 6 P.M. the Fore top top sail Rumer parted and came down by the Rumer run and injured a Man by the Name of John Nigger Mace part fresh wind from N and some rain in squalls Latter part Repairing light wind and cloudy weather the ship on the North and Westward tack the ship M. top sail on deck Repairing no sun

175 Tuesday 30th Bore with fine wind from the N and cloudy weather the ship on the North and Westward tack the watch employed in Repairing Main top sail Mace and Latter part light wind from the N E and the Fore top N N E the ship on the N Westward tack the watch employed in Repairing the Fore top sail fine pleasant weather Lat 35:00 N Long 174:27 W

176 Wednesday 1st Bore with light wind from out the N E and E N E steering N W by N at 4 P.M. to finish the Fore top sail Mace and Latter part light wind from the E steering N W by N and N W the watch employed in Repairing the Fore sail and fitting a New Fore sail West Boat fine pleasant weather Lat 36:10 N Long 175:06 W
