May 1867
 177 Thursday 2^d Come with light winds from
 Gillinga the N.E. steering N.W. at 4 P.M. sent the
 New Boat Home sail fine pleasant weather Midair
 Boat and latter part light winds from the N and
 making out fine weather employed in dealing out Slops
 Slops and cleaning out the rorials

178 Friday 3^d Come with light winds from the
 breeze N.W. the ship on the North and Easton
 the Wind tack at 6 P.M. squalls of rain the wind
 shifted to the N. lashed ship to the West
 making ward Middle and latter part light
 a S.W. wind and calmed the watch employed
 for the middle various jobs Lat 37° 50' N
 Long 176° 37' W

179 Saturday 4th Come with light air and calm
 breeze and fine pleasant weather the watch
 employed in various jobs Midair and
 broke out latter part fine breeze from the S and some
 for water rainey steering N.W. & N under all sail
 Lat 39° 44'

180 Sunday 5th Come with fine winds from the
 S and some rainey and foggy steering N.W.
 & N by compass Midair and latter part
 fresh wind from the S and foggy and
 rainey weather steering the ship under
 all sail no sun

181 Monday 6th Come with fresh wind from
 the S.S.W. and hailing gradually to the
 leach. Bore West and increasing at 4 P.M. rainey West
 from the Moderate gale the ship about the off Main
 top sail top sail and Hon sail Midair and
 latter part fresh Gales from the N the ship
 on the Northward tack Lat 43° 53'
 Long 178° 37' W

 182 Tuesday 7th Come with light gales from
 the N the ship on the Northward tack the
 Gillinga the Gale Moderating some rain some
 Lashings sail Midair and light winds from
 and sailing W.S.W. the ship on the Northward
 stage Westward tack latter part light winds
 from S.W. steering N.W. the watch employe
 ed in various jobs Lat 45° 06' N
 Long 179° 17' W

183 Wednesday 8th Come with light winds from
 the S.W. steering N.W. the watch employed
 in fitting for Whaling Midair part Light
 winds from S.E. latter fresh gales from
 the E and working to the North with
 plenty of rain and unpleasant weather
 weather steering N.W. by compass

184 Friday 10th Come with light gales from N &
 light gales N. N. E. and rain the ship on the North
 ward N and Westward tack under close reef tops
 under rain sails plenty of rain at sundown moderate
 some and the rainey gradually
 turned to the North and westward Midair
 a foggy part light gales from the S and N.W. at
 midnight wore ship to the North and East
 West Boat on tack latter part light wind from the
 N and hauling to the Southward Lat 48° 10'
 Long 178° 26' E

185 Saturday 11th Come with fresh wind from the
 Bore a S.W. steering N.W. the watch employed in
 stage sail various jobs Midair part Light Gales
 from S.W. and foggy latter part plenty
 of rain steering N.W. by N it was very unpleasant
 weather the Gale increasing Lat 50° 30' N
 Long 176° 32' E
