

Remarks Pass On Board Ship Constitution

May 1867
194 Monday 20th Come with light winds from N. N. E the ship on the Eastern tack under all sail some snow. Midday part light winds from N. N. W and N. W the ship on the Eastern tack. Latter part fresh winds from the W. Steering N. N. E. easy weather. Lat 59° 51' N Long 170° 42' E

195 Tuesday 21st Come with fine weather a gentle breeze from the W steering N by E at 1 P. M. Ogloutsky raised Cape Ogloutsky, being N. W distant 10 leagues. Midday and Latter part put out light air and calms from E. at 8 A. M. a new boat put out the Mast boat and took the old Mast Boat for the Starboard Bow Boat. Thick smoky weather. Lat 60° 25' N

196 Wednesday 22nd Come with light air and the Cooper calms from the E and N. E saw some floating the ship to the East of us pleasant weather. S. B. B. Midday and Latter part light air from the E to N. E the ship on opposite tacks saw 3 ships bound to the N. E. Lat 60° 50' N Long 172° 12' E

197 Thursday 23rd Come with light winds from E to N. E the ship on different tacks in by the Land. Midday and Latter part light wind from N. N. E to E. N. E the ship under all sail beating along the land to and from the N. E. 3 ships in sight for 2 B. S. and put the new ship this day took in the fore top Gallant sail to stand Mast Head and anchor in the Crow's Nest the watch employed the forecastle, cargo and Jobs.

198 Friday 24th Come with light winds from N. N. E the ship working along the land to the N. E. 3 sails in sight at 6 P. M. set the fore top Gallant sail. Midday and Latter part light winds from N. to N. W the ship on the bank the North and Eastern tack with fine all day weather saw a few ships. Lat 61° 10' N Long 175° 33' E

199 Saturday 25th Come with light winds from the ship N. N. W to N. W a fine pleasant Constitution weather the ship on the North and Eastern tack under all sail none ship in sight for a while. Midday and Latter part light winds from the S. W and West steering N. E at 3 A. M. raised the Ice. Lat 61° 36' N

200 Sunday 26th Come with light wind from the N. N. W and N. W fine weather the ship steering along the West side saw 2 ships of the Ice to the Northward at 3 P. M. lower the Mast Boat and caught a Fur Seal the land in sight and 2 ships and a plenty of Orkneyed Midday part gave the at 8 P. M. spoke the ship G. Norolana and gave G. Norolana his letters. Latter part light winds from her Boat all pointed of the compass at 9 A. M. the Capt of the G. Norolana came on Board and made a gain and took on board his boat. Lat 61° 44' N Long 178° 27' E

201 Monday 27th Come with light winds from N. N. W Ice & ship steering along the Ice to the N. E. Cape Morris for. Norolana sailing N. N. E. a number of sails in sight. Midday part light wind from the S. W Latter part wind N. and a thick snow. Chief of stow steering N. N. E at 10 A. M. came up Berg 1. Lat to the Ice point N. W. Lat 62° 35' N Long 178° 48' N
