

Remarks Log On Board Ship Cornelian

218 Wednesday 12th Come with fresh rain from S to SE thick fog the most of the time steering through the straits into the Arctic in company with the Eagle of Hardside. Midday part at 10 P.M. came up to the Ice lugged to untell 3.4 M the fog light Boiling made sail steering N N W latter part at 9.4 M saw the Eagle and plenty of Whales and a few no whaled at 11.4 M started the rounds the ship steering different course looking for whaled Lat 68° 11' N

219 Thursday 13th Come with fresh rain from S to SE thick and foggy the most of the time at 1 P.M. tack ship to the S W plenty of Ice Midday and latter part fresh rain from the S to SE and thick fog the most of the time saw 5 ships and more a Boiling and plenty of Ice and Whales Lat 68° 05' N Long 170° 03'

220 Friday 14th Come with light wind from the S to SE and thick fog the most of the time saw 4 ships and plenty of Ice no whaled Midday and latter part light wind from the S to SE and clear weather saw number of ships and a boiling 6 of them at 8 P.M. finish Boiling at 11.4 M raised whaled four 4 boats 17 ships but no luck Lat 68° 19' N

221 Saturday 15th Come with light air and clear and clear saw a few whales at 5 P.M. lower for them but no luck it a calm Midday and latter part light wind from the SE and some fog saw a few whaled and plenty of ships all hands employed in stowing down in Main Hatch Lat 68° 23' N

While on Her Northern Cruise

June 16th 222 Sunday 16th Come with light wind from the N and some fog at 5 P.M. spoke the ship George 4 Howland Howland 2 Whales Midday part light wind from N and some fog the ship and the Northern tack latter part fine weather wind from W at 11.4 M spoke the ship Eugene 1. B. 11 Whales Lat 68° 58' N Long 168° 44'

223 Monday 17th Come with light rain from the N Eugene the ship steering to the Eastward along the Ice 11 Whales a few ships in sight Midday and latter part fine weather light air at 9.4 M spoke the ship Maringo a George 1 Whales 13 ships in sight and more Lat 68° 48' N Long 168° 18' W

224 Tuesday 18th Come with light wind from the S Maringo a S. W. the ship rounding to the South and Eastward along the Ice saw the land by Cape Lisburne distant 40 miles saw the ship Maringo a Whaling Midday and latter part fine rain a few whaled from the S. S. W and pleasant weather in afternoon at 4.4 M lower for a Whale but as usual did not see them again saw 1 Bk a cutting Lat 68° 38' N Long 168° 34'

225 Wednesday 19th Come with fine wind and weather from S. S. W the ship rounding to the Southward saw the land plenty of Ice and ships saw 1 ship a cutting Boiling and 1 a Boiling Midday part fresh rain from the Southward spoke the Bk Howland 12 Whales Bk Howland saw a number of ships a Whaling and Boiling and cutting and a few whaled but no chance to catch them latter part the same in a few whaled but no chance to catch them 38 ships in sight and a good many of them a Boiling ship emerging quick Lat 67° 57' N
