

Remarks and On Board Ship Cornithian

- July 1867  
26<sup>th</sup> Thursday 2<sup>o</sup> Corn with light air from the N and some fog the ship on the Southern tack along the Ice at 1 P.M. spoke the Bk. Eagle of Honolulu 6 whales. Micael part the same. Latter part calmed at 9 A.M. bore away the Bk. John Miller 4 whales. Lat 70° 27' N Long 175° 24' W
- 26<sup>th</sup> Friday 3<sup>o</sup> Corn with light air and calmed 2 whales at 1 P.M. four 2 boats and sent them in the Ice at 5 P.M. came on Board with 2 watermen. Micael part light air and calmed. Latter part light wind from the E the ship working to the E and Eastward along the Ice. Lat 70° 00' N Long 175° 20'
- 26<sup>th</sup> Saturday 2<sup>o</sup> Corn with fresh wind from E the ship on the South tack with fog the most of the time saw a few ships. Micael part the same. Latter part light wind from S. Micael part the ship running along the Ice to the NE saw nothing but 12 ships. Lat 70° 00' N Long 177° 17'
- 26<sup>th</sup> Sunday 3<sup>o</sup> Corn with light wind from the SE. Herald the ship on the N and Eastward tack under all sail no Ice in sight. Micael part light wind from the E and fog the ship off and on the Ice. Lat 70° 35' N Long 177° 37' W
- 26<sup>th</sup> Monday 2<sup>o</sup> Corn with fresh wind from E and clear the ship along the Ice at 5 P.M. four 4 boats for watermen at 5 P.M. saw Herald Island bearing N by N by compass. Micael part at 10 P.M. the boats came on Board with 9 watermen. Latter part fresh wind from E the ship on the Northern tack saw a few ships steering from all points of the compass.

While Cruising in Arctic Ocean 1867

- July 1867  
26<sup>th</sup> Tuesday 3<sup>o</sup> Corn with fresh wind from the E. Bk. R. Brown steering along the Ice to the westward at 3 1/2 miles 1 P.M. spoke the Bk. Robert Brown 3 whales. Some fog see no whales. Micael part light wind from the E and some fog the ship on the South tack saw a plenty of ships. Lat 71° 20' N Long 174° 15' W
- 26<sup>th</sup> Wednesday 3<sup>o</sup> Corn with fresh wind from the E the ship under short sail and opposite tack the Ice in sight and plenty of ships. Micael and Latter part light gales to the E and the ship on different tack along the Ice saw none but a whaling and plenty of ships. Lat 71° 15' N Herald Island N N W
- 26<sup>th</sup> Thursday 1<sup>o</sup> Corn with light gales from the NE by E the ship off & on the Ice some fog a plenty of ships. Herald in sight no whales a heavy swell from the NE. Micael and Latter part fresh wind from the NE at 8 A.M. spoke the ships Quous & Perry saw a plenty of ships and none a Bering and a few whales. Lat 71° 11' N
- 27<sup>th</sup> Friday 2<sup>o</sup> Corn with fresh wind from NE steering E S E the ship Quous in company B. and to Capt. Esbensen after water. Micael part some fog took us sail and huffed to at 10 P.M. the fog light made some sail steering along the Ice to the S and Eastward spoke the ship Champion saw a plenty of ships. Latter part light gales from the N N E and no Ice the Quous in company saw a plenty of ships on the N and westward tack. Lat 69° 13' N Long 170° 02' W
