

Remarks Port On Board Ship Conductor

Aug 1867
271 Saturday³ Come with light gales from the NNE the ship on the E. side tack the Rk. Since 10 AM we saw many Miacas and latter part of the day gales from the NNE sailing ENE at 3 AM raised Cape Lisburne bearing NE by N at 8 AM drove ship off shore and spoke the James and heard again at 10 AM to fresh to water

272 Sunday⁴ Come with light gales off and on the land under easy sail waiting for the wind to go down Miacas part light wind from the at Anchor NNE and give weather latter part of the weather after water the wind light from all points of the compass at 8 AM came to Anchor in 9 fathoms of water about noon half miles from the shore the Bk. James in company at 9 AM sent the Boat in at 11 AM it came off

273 Monday⁵ Come with calms the officers on shore at 9 PM a light wind sprang up from SW call all hands and took the Anchor starting NW Miacas part light wind and cleared some fog latter part of the day light wind from SW and fog the most of the day Miacas sailing NNE some of the time and some of the time laying aback at 9 AM started the engines to boil out Miacas saw 3 Bk. no wind

274 Tuesday⁶ Come with light wind from SW at 1 PM the fog light saw a Barque a whaling after a bowhead but galley him Miacas part light wind from SW and rain and unpleasant latter part light wind the SW and unpleasant a heavy swell from the SW some fog Cape Lisburne bearing SW by S wind from the Westward

275 Wednesday⁷ Come with fresh wind from the N and a heavy swell from the SW Cape Lisburne bearing by compass SW by S distant 7 leagues the Bk. R. Coronis in sight Miacas and latter part fresh wind from the N and some snow steering NE along the land the Robert Coronis in sight

276 Thursday⁸ Come with light gales from the N the ship on the North tack and it a thick snow storm at 4 PM it light up a little and rose found the ship in heavy with the low land to the S of the Cape more ship and call all hands and made sail Miacas part fresh wind from the NNE the ship under all sail working off shore to the Westward latter part light wind from the NNE and some rain in equalled Boat went at 6 AM four all 4 Boats for Ship Tacks at 8 AM the Torboard boat struck and and got Willets at 9 AM took him along side the store light B Boat still chasing at 10 AM commenced to cut at noon finished the Bow Boat still chasing the Torboard Boat got stove in hitting the whale but came along side all right Lat 69° 19' N

277 Friday⁹ Come with light air and calms the Bow Boat still chasing at 1 PM four the Cape Lisburne Harbor and West Boat but no luck it being a calm at 4 PM the Boats came on Board Cape Lisburne bearing by compass S. S. W distant 10 leagues Miacas part light air and calms from the E latter part the came the ship on the North tack westward tack saw 4 ships but no whale it a cloudy overcast no sun
