

Remarks Made On Board Ship Constitution

Sept 1867
306 Tuesday 3rd Cow with fresh wind from the S the ship working to the Sward 2 ships in sight 4 men sick off duty. Miacas and latter broke out part light Gale from the S the ship on opposite for water tack working to the Southward some snow & Met squalls 2 ships in sight Lat 70° 58' N Long 169° 26' W

307 Wednesday 4th Cow with fresh Gale from the South and fresh snow squalls the ship working to the Sward Miacas part the same the rain S N blowing fresh latter part light Gale from the West and fresh snow squalls and unpleasant weather saw 1 Bk Lat 70° 53' N Long 169° 21' W

308 Thursday 5th Cow with light Gale from the N no whales S N the ship on opposite tack some snow squalls saw 1 Bk Miacas part the same latter part light wind from S N the ship on the S and Easton tack saw a few ships Lat 70° 28' N Long 169° 06' W

309 Friday 6th Cow with light wind from S N and no whales S N steering Lat 4 P M spoke the Bk Chum 4 whales the same at 7 P M part of company steering S by compass Miacas part at 1 A M luffed to trying a back for a while from the S N E latter part light Gale from the S N E steering N N by W see nothing Lat 70° 20' N Long 169° 07' W

310 Saturday 7th Cow with light Gale from S N E some snow squalls the ship on the N N tack no whales Miacas and latter part the same the ship on the Northern tack see nothing Lat 71° 18' N Long 169° 53' W

311 Sunday 8th Cow with fresh Gale from S E the ship on the Easton tack under storm sails Miacas part fresh Gale from S E and thick snow storm latter part fresh Gale from E N E the ship on the S and Easton tack no saw Hecla and Hecla

312 Monday 9th Cow with fresh Gale from Hecla E N E the ship on the same Easton tack Miacas part the same at 1 A M more ships to the Northward latter part light Gale from S E and rain the ship under short Miacas sail on opposite tack no saw

313 Tuesday 10th Cow with light rain from the Hecla S E and a heavy swell and rain the ship the constitution under easy sail nothing in sight Miacas with a whole and latter part light Gale from the S E and rain the ship and a thick fog the ship under easy sail at 9 P M started to the ship's starboard pump out and from pump broke it broke in the Miacas and head to condemn it no saw

314 Wednesday 11th Cow with light Gale from the no whales S E steering to the North and westward a few passing rain squalls and fog squalls Miacas and latter part light Gale from the S E & N E and a few passing snow squalls Lat 70° 38' N Long 170° 50' W

315 Thursday 12th Cow with fresh Gale from the S E the ship on the Easton tack at 2 P M took in the fore and Mizzen top sails Miacas and latter part the same some snow squalls Lat 70° 25' N Long 171° 53' W
