340 Monday 7th Bore with fresh gales from E & E
Boiling saw 1 whale in by the Ice and 1 ship at 3 P.M.
7th more ship off from the Ice heading E & E
under close reef Fore & Main top sails at 6 P.M.
cooled down plenty of snow and cold
Midale and later part the same

341 Tuesday 8th Bore with fresh gales from
NE and soon and very cold the ship on
the Easton tack under close reef Top sails
4 ships in sight at 2 P.M. Charles Haves
a Boat steered out of his four Engines on
his right hand by the missing Engine
Midale & later part the same ship on E tack
no sun

342 Wednesday 9th Bore with fresh gales from
NE the ship on the Easton tack at 1 P.M.
the BK. exchanged Long & Lattitude with the
Eugenia BK Eugenia of N.B. the watch employed in
runing Oil in the Ground Clear plenty of snow
Midale part moderated some Latter part
started the mounds and commenced to slow
down but it commenced to blow up a fresh
gale again so gave up storing down

part moderated some saw 1 ship on the

storing in storing down Oil at 3 P.M. the breeze spring
down up from NE steering SE at 4 P.M. finish
92 Bore storing down and chocked off the Main Water
Midale part fresh wind from the N. N. E. and
NE and plenty of snow steering SE Latter part
fresh wind from NE and E N E the wind
very unsteady Lat 66° 35' N
Long 169° 00' W

347 Monday 14th Bore with light wind from
N N E to NE steering SE by S at 4 P.M. raised
the land by Cape East bearing S by W distant
35 Miles at 7 P.M. took in some sail and
luffed to the wind Midale part light wind
from the N. N. E. and pleasant Latter part
by Arctic fresh wind from the N steering SE for
for this Cape Prince of Wales at 11 A.M. took in
sail and stood on to try to get water but
found the wind too strong and gave it up
