355 Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> Come with fine wind from  
S.W. and some snow squalls steering  
S by E saw 2 other ships steering the same  
the cutting sent down the cutting. Tabled Mian and  
Latter part fresh Gale from N.W. at 2 A.M.  
No hefted to at 4 A.M. creep of steering  
S.E. fresh squalls at 6 A.M. raised the Lana  
172 Pass the Eastern Glaciers of 172 Passage at 9 A.M.  
raised 2 Bk. at 11 A.M. steering S.E. the  
2 Bk. Glaciers of Sproukto bearing E.N.E. by compa  
distant 3 Leagues. Lat 52° 13'

356 Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> Come with fine Gale from  
the N.W. and fresh snow squalls the ship  
under all sail steering by compass S.E. 2  
Bk. in sight Mian and Latter part fine  
wind from the N.W. steering S.E. a few passing  
snow squalls none Bk. in sight Lat 49° 20'

357 Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> Come with fine breeze from the  
N.W. and a few passing snow squalls  
steering S.E. by compass Mian and  
Latter part light wind from the N.W. and  
a few passing rain squalls other wind  
pleasant Lat 46° 27' N  
Long 167° 16' W

358 Friday 25<sup>th</sup> Come with pleasant weather wind  
N.W. steering S.E. by compass Mian part light  
wind from the N. Latter part light air  
and calm from the N.W. and I saw some ships  
in sight the watch employed in various  
Duties

359 Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> Come with light wind from the  
Bk. in E the ship on the Southern tack some rain  
sight cloudy over east Mian part fine wind  
from the N.E. steering S.E. some rain plenty  
light of Poppoises Latter part fresh wind  
rain and light gales with rain from N.E. and  
N.N.E. a light steady rain no sun

360 Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> Come with fresh Gale from  
light N.W. with light rain steering S.E. the weather  
rain Looking Bad the ship under double  
reef. Top sails fore sail & Jib Mian  
Cmied part fresh Gale from the N.W. and heavy sea  
Lockers at 1 A.M. in the Mian watch the chain  
broke and Lockers broke loose and broke the Pump  
and as before they could be secured Latter part  
the Pump fresh Gale from the N.W. with fresh hail  
squalls Lat 39° 22' N  
Long 162° 40' W

361 Monday 28<sup>th</sup> Come with fresh Gale from  
the N.N.W. steering S.E. by compass some  
rain squalls Mian part fine wind from  
N.N.W. to N.N.E. steering S.E. Latter part  
fine wind from N.N.E. the watch employed  
none of in making none good Pump out of the broken  
the Pump room fine pleasant weather no sun

the N.E. steering S.E. pleasant weather the
